Mercians enjoyed performances by the Joyce Winter Dancers, and a

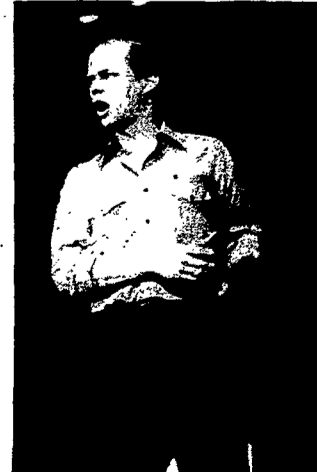


Bill Coughlin, English teacher, acts out a reading from Don Quixote.

BASEBALL — Mark Oberlies drove in four runs with two doubles to lead Bishop Kearney to a 6-4 victory over Aquinas. Relief pitcher Mike Beaudrie picked up the save.

Peter Palermo pitched a three-hitter and smashed a two-run homer to be McQuaid's one-man wrecking crew in a 3-1 win over previously unbeaten Cardinal Mooney. Palermo whiffed 18 batters en route to his fifth victory of the year without a loss. He has also thrown three shutouts and has a 0.92 earned run average over 88 innings.

Frank Fiannaca and Mark Oberlies drove in two runs apiece as Bishop Kearney whipped Marshall, 13-4, at Kearney.

Rob Liberatore hit a two-run double and Tony Alomar smashed a two-run homer to lift Aquinas over Jefferson, 10-7, at Edgerton Park.

Rich Razzante belted his third and fourth homers of the season as Cardinal Mooney rolled to a 10-5 win over Charlotte at Mooney.

Cardinal Mooney defeated Aquinas, 9-0, in the title game of the Churchillville-Chili tournament. Charley Kelly pitched a three-hitter for the Cardinals. Dave Dasch won the MVP award for the tourney, ripping two triples in the title game. Mooney beat Hilton, 5-1, in their first game.

Battaglia also slugged a run-scoring triple to the centerfield fence in the sixth inning. Jim Nietopski went 3-for-4 and Zach Rivera was 2-for-4 for Mooney.

TRACK — The McQuaid track team won the final two relay events to complete a 76-70 come-from-behind victory over Bishop Kearney in a City-Catholic League meet at Franklin. The Knights won the 1600-meter relay to take the lead, 71-70, then won the 800-relay to clinch the win.

Aquinas sophomores Sam Guerrieri and Len Fetterly won the 400 and 3200-meter events, respectively, to lift the Little Irish to a 108-32 romp over East High.

Greg Reyner of Cardinal Mooney was chosen as the top boys' athlete at the His and Her's Invitational track

and field meet at Brockport State. Reyner won the discus and shot put events.

Tom Warth won the 800- and 1600-meter runs to lead McQuaid over Franklin, 87-48, at Franklin.

Cardinal Mooney crushed East High, 109-32, at East. Double winners for the Cardinals were Greg Reyner in the shot put and discus; Dennis Killion, high jump and long jump; and Paul Hilling in the mile and half-mile runs.

Bishop Kearney drubbed Aquinas, 92-36, at Franklin. Kearney has four double winners: David Lee, shot put and discus; Lyndon Gross, high jump and 110 hurdles; Matt Abate, 400 and 800 runs; and Jim Oberst, 1600 and 3200 runs.

Beth Buddenbeck hurled a one-hitter to lift Bishop Kearney over visiting Harley-Allendale-Columbia, 4-0. In her next start, Buddenbeck pitched a five-hitter, raising her record to 6-1 as Kearney (7-1) defeated Irondequoit, 13-5. She also had two hits and scored twice. Donna Dedee had two hits and five runs batted in, and Julie Aspenleiter had three runs batted in.
