Archdiocese Must Pay for Platform

Washington (RNS) — A protracted dispute over who should pay for a platform built by the city of Philadelphia for a Mass offered by Pope John Paul II ended here when the Supreme Court let stand lower court rulings that the bill must be paid by the Roman Catholic archdiocese.

The suit against the city leading to the May 18 high court action was brought by two Philadelphia women, the Board of

National Ministries of the Baptist Churches in the U.S.A. and the American Civil Liberties Union.

Both a federal district court judge in Philadelphia and the Third Circuit Court of Appeals upheld the women's position that the city violated the Constitution's ban on an establishment of religion by paying for construction costs and flowers and shrubbery for the occasion.
