ND Tennis Team To Get Own Courts

Elmira — Ground was broken June 11 for tennis courts at Notre Dame High School which should be completed in August.

The groundbreaking ceremony took place even as work was proceeding on the three courts. Notre Dame has had a successful tennis team for many years, but no courts. A fund to build courts was established by the 1976 tennis team, but it took the \$10,000 gift by George Zurenda in memory of his wife to make the construction start possible.

Zurenda presented a check to Sister Beatrice Curran, Notre Dame tennis coach, at the ceremonies. Christine Ayotte, a member of this

year's team, presented a plaque to Sister Beatrice in recognition of her work with the team.

Zurenda, Sister Beatrice, and seniors on this year's undefeated team took turns breaking the ground. Members of the 1976 team which started the fund attended the ceremonies.

The courts will be completed in time for ND to launch a girls' team in September, a first for the school. Its spring teams have been co-ed, and have competed almost exclusively against all-male teams. The addition of the girls' team will give more students the opportunity to participate in the sport.
