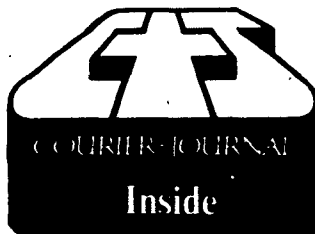

Chinese Catholic Church Makes Five New Bishops In Defiance of Vatican

Peking (RNS) — In a gesture of defiance of the Vatican, the government-sponsored Chinese Catholic Patriotic Association has consecrated five new bishops.

The televised ceremony which took place at a church in Nanking on July 24 in the presence of government officials marked a further step in a conflict with the Vatican that arose in June when Pope John Paul II named a Chinese Jesuit bishop as archbishop of Canton.

The papal action was denounced at the time by the Catholic association as a "rude interference" in the "sovereign affairs of the Chinese church."

The 73-year-old Jesuit prelate, Dominic Tan Yiming, who was ordained bishop and assigned as apostolic administrator of Canton by the

Vatican in 1951, was released in June 1980 after 22 years in prison on charges of being a counter-revolutionary.

Following his release, the Catholic Patriotic Association named him bishop of Canton and allowed him to take up his functions as leader of the diocese.

But after the pope announced the bishop's appointment as archbishop of Canton, the association declared him disqualified for the post.

Bishop Tang had met with Vatican Secretary of State Cardinal Agostino Casaroli in Hong Kong in February and had a private audience with Pope John Paul on April 30 at the Vatican.

The five newly-consecrated Chinese Bishops are Qian Huimin of Nanking, Ma

Longlin of Suzhou, Xu Zhengjia of Shenyang, Zhao Jinnong of Tianshui, and Zhang Wenling of Dali.

Twenty-two bishops participated in the consecration ceremony, including Bishop Zong Huaide of Jinan, president of the Catholic Patriotic Association, and Bishop Fu Tieshan on Peking.

Riccio had urged, but decided that he was to be given "all opportune facilities" for his new task.

It is not known if Father Riccio ever learned of this action. If Rome's letter to him took as long en route as his to Rome, it would not have arrived in Manila until 1687. But Father Riccio died on Feb. 17, 1685, at 64, at the monastery in Manila.

According to Father Wintgen's research, Father Riccio was born near Florence in 1621. He joined

the Dominicans in Fiesole and changed his name from Ricci to Riccio when he took up work among the Chinese at Manila.

A gifted linguist, he was at one time apostolic prefect of Formosa and also was instrumental in creating the Pontifical University of St. Thomas, still in existence in Manila.
