Wayne Groups Slate IYDP Conference

Newark — The Wayne Council for the International Year of the Disabled will hold a conference on making buildings accessible Oct. 23 at the Rowntowner here.

Participants will also be offered tours of a Community Residence, the Association for Retarded Citizens Workshop, Newark-Wayne Hospital's Occupational Therapy and Physical Therapy Units, and the Newark Developmental Center.

Performances will be staged by the Newark Mental Health Players and by "The Kids Project," a puppet show depicting disabilities.

One of the conference's aims is to advise local businessmen and merchants of the funding available to aid them in making their buildings accessible. Following the conference a

pamphlet will be available listing those businesses and organizations in Wayne County that are accessible to the disabled, according to Norman Brust of the Newark Developmental Center.

On the evening of the conference, a basketball game between the Rochester Wheels and area businessmen will be held at 7:30 at the Newark Developmental Center gym.

Honorary co-chairmen of the event are Marvin Decker, chairman of the Wayne County Board of Supervisors, and Harry Hallow, supervisor from Williamson.
