### **Feeney Group Readmitted**

Still River, Mass. - In a simple ceremony, 29 members of the Slaves of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, founded in 1940 by Father Leonard Feeney, SJ, who was later encommunicated for his views on salvation, were readmitted into the Roman Catholic Church.

The 29 - 14 monks and 15 nuns - professed formal, although temporary, vows, as Benedictines.

Father Feeney had been reconciled to the Church in 1972 by Pope Paul VI, through the intercession of Cardinal Húmberto Medieros of Boston.

Not all Father Feeney's followers, however, have reentered the church. Shortly before the priest's death in 1978, a group of his followers broke away and maintain a residence less than 100 feet from the new Benedictines.
