

## Our Catholic Heritage

During this school year, from Oct. 7 until the last week in May, The Courier-Journal will be publishing a 34-part series, "Our Catholic Heritage," a survey of the history of the Catholic Church and of the people who helped shape it. Below is a week-by-week schedule outlining the series and the list of men and women who will be profiled.

Next year, The Courier Journal plans to continue this series with the history of the Catholic Church in the New World in general and in the United States in particular.

We believe that "Our Catholic Heritage" will be ideal for use as an aid in religious instruction in the classroom, in the family or for personal enlightenment.

One author of the series will be **Msgr. James F. Connelly**, professor of Church history at St. Charles Borromeo Seminary since 1970 and the author of histories of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia and of St. Charles

Seminary. Msgr. Connelly, who holds a doctorate in Church history from the Pontifical Gregorian University in Rome, was vice rector for theology at St. Charles Seminary (1968-71) and chairman of the Liturgical Committee for the Canonization of St. John Neumann.

**Father Thomas McManus** is the other series author, also an alumnus of the Pontifical Gregorian University.

Noted Philadelphia artist **Robert F. McGovern** will illustrate the weekly series. McGovern is noted for his work in pen and ink, wood cuts, sculpture, watercolors, and oil and canvas. He teaches drawing, design and anatomy at Philadelphia College of Art and is co-chairman of the foundation department.
