home," coresponsibility and creative tensions. "There is a legitimate diversity in the Church," he said, "and we are now celebrating that diversity."

The Church's mission, he said, "is always the same, though it differs in expression. That mission encompasses teaching, sanctifying and serving."

disabuse ourselves of our stereotypes" of what government means when we discuss the Church, he said.

The Church does not follow the models of civil government, business or voluntary civil organizations, he said.

"The Church is a mystery, we always have to make adjustments in our models," he observed.

He encouraged the council members to recognize the distinction between policy making and policy implementing, and the function of the principle of advice and consent, a principle, he said was identical in both the Roman and the American legal tradition.

He also outlined the provenance of each council in the teaching of Rome. The Diocesan Pastoral Council exists, he said, because "all the people of God are equal in

responsibility for the local Church."

Since the bishop and his priests constitute the hierarchical communion, they form the link between the local Church and the Church worldwide.

It is for these reasons, Father Provost said, Rome considers the two councils to be "pre-eminent" in position in any diocese.

The third council represents the "holiness dimension of the Church," he said. Here, the Diocesan Sisters Council is a "witness for the Holy Catholic," because it is composed of persons who live the vowed life.

All three, he said, play an important role in the consultative process; but the bishop, as the center, "holds things together, as prophet, priest and servant-king in our midst."
