Teachers Convene To Assess Their Goals

"Catholic educators are to turn the world upside down on a new axis, if they are to follow the mission of Jesus!" With these words Sister Clare Fitzgerald, SSND, challenged the 1200 school teachers in

the diocese at the annual Teachers' Conference Sept. 28 at Cardinal Mooney High School, and on Sept. 29 at St. Mary Our Mother, Horsheds.

Following her theme, "The Mission of Jesus: the Ministry of Education," Sister Clare told Catholic educators that they cannot minister in education if they do not follow the mission of Jesus. She told them that we are in an age of a new Exodus in which we are moving from the passage of the security of the tombs — even though they be dark and damp and cold — to enter into the risk of sunlight and to move into the trackless deserts to tell the Pharaohs of today to "Let my people go."

The conference was sponsored by the diocese as a means of unifying the teachers throughout the system and recommitting them to the role of the uniqueness of Catholic school educators.

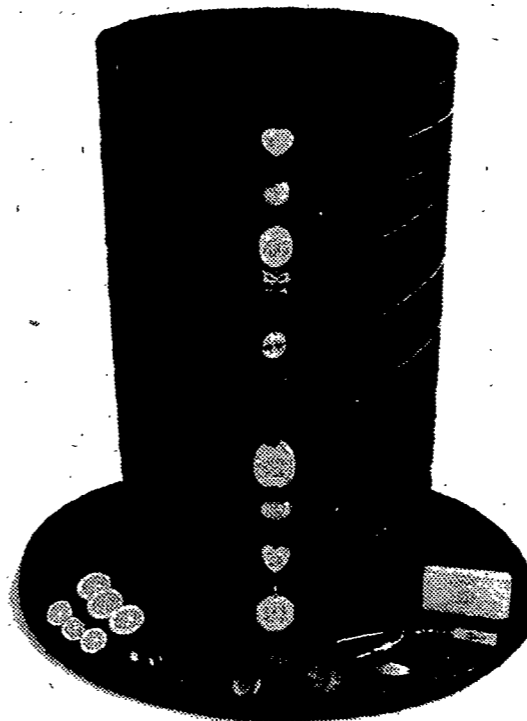
