

Seton Groups Prepare Annual Fundraisers

The Seton Sale and Ball, two of the local Catholic women's group's most prominent annual events, will celebrate their 25th and 26th anniversaries, respectively, this fall.

The Seton Sale is chaired this year by Pat Hammele of Penfield and Marg Sertl of Pittsford, and takes place from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Saturday, Oct. 24, in the Otto Shults Center at Nazareth College.

Items for sale include hand-sewn handbags, a knitted Irish afghan, China paintings, hand-crafted latchhook rugs, and hand-crocheted and knitted baby bonnets and sweaters, among many others.

Items will also be marked with silver stars commemorating the sale's silver anniversary.

Other highlights include Christmas ornaments and baked goods sales, a silent auction, antiques, and, new this year, a swim-a-thon, in which all entrants will be given tee-shirts.

The Seton Ball, entitled "Visions," is scheduled for Saturday, Nov. 21, at the Americana Hotel. According to Gen Greisberger of Pittsford, chairman for the event; the evening will feature French cuisine and dancing to the music of Tom Monte.

All monies accumulated by the two major fund-raisers will go towards the upcoming multi-million dollar modernization of St. Mary's Hospital.

This year's funds will be used to equip an operating suite which will be part of the hospital's new surgical wing. Monies raised last year by Seton projects totaled more than \$100,000, and will be used for the outpatient ambulatory surgery portion of the new wing.
