Long Island Diocese Begins Replacing Striking Teachers

Rockville Centre (RNS) — Church school administrators here have begun hiring permanent replacements for Catholic teachers still on strike against four diocesan high schools.

School officials said 112 teachers failed to show up by an Oct. 19 deadline set by the diocese in a letter mailed Oct. 8. Another 40 teachers who had joined the strike at the beginning of the school year returned to their classrooms.

A spokeswoman said School Superintendent Hugh F. Carroll dismissed the strikers because "the union and the diocese were so far apart there was no chance they'd ever come to an agreement."

The Lay Faculty Association had asked for a 20 percent increase in a two-year contract. The diocese had offered 10 percent.

This is the first time that a Catholic diocese has moved to dismiss striking teachers since the U.S. Supreme Court ruled in 1979 that the National Labor Relations Board had no jurisdiction in disputes involving teachers in church-related schools.

Meanwhile, a committee of widely-known Catholic theologians and an international theological magazine are attempting to persuade the Vatican to order another revision of the proposed new code.

The attempts were seen in the Vatican as a last-ditch effort to prevent ratification of the current draft which, if approved, will be promulgated by Pope John Paul II in December and become the law throughout the Catholic Church a year later.

Both the theologians, which include such luminaries as Karl Rahner, Yves Congar and Hans Urs von Balthazar, and the magazine, Concilium, charge that the proposed text ignores the spirit of Vatican Council II and the theological advances reflected in the Vatican's decrees since the council.

The participation of Father Urs von Balthazar in the protest is considered significant because he is one of the pope's favorite writers and because he has rarely taken part in such statements.

Dr. Edmund Pellegrino has resigned as president of the Catholic University of America effective next July 1. He said he wanted to return to teaching and research.

A federal grand jury has indicted Sun Myung Moon on 12 counts of conspiring to defraud the government on taxes. The preacher, "is accused of failing to report most of the interest accrued on a \$1.6 million bank account in his name between 1973 and 1975 and of failing to report \$50,000 in securities he had received in 1973... 
