

Charities Honors Staff And Volunteer Helpers

Catholic Charities honored its own last week at its annual meeting and dinner. Bishop Matthew H. Clark presented three St. Vincent DePaul awards to men and two St. Louise DeMarillac awards to women who have extensively given of their time to Charities organizations.

In turn, the bishop was presented with a special surprise, a pen used by Gov. Hugh Carey in signing the 15 percent state welfare increase for which Bishop Clark lobbied intensively.

St. Vincent DePaul awards

were presented to Charles M. Bayer, whose family has been associated with Charities since 1917, and who has served as trustee for 30 years, as secretary for several, as chairman of the adoption committee, as chairman of the Camp Stella Maris Advisory Committee and as contributor to the Joint Housing Committee; to William W. Bleier, a trustee for 10 years, chairman of the Nominating Committee, chairman of the Affiliation Committee, and chairman of the Agency Relations Committee; and to Gerald H. Pashby, chief social worker for the DePaul Mental Health Services, an agency

staffer for 21 years.

St. Louise DeMarillac awards were given to Catherine Wobus, a 38-year employee of the Catholic Family Center, now the casework director there, who has been engaged in nearly every facet of the center's operations; and to Marie M. Harrison, who has worked for 10 years at the Catholic Youth Organization, mostly as office manager.

Main speaker for the evening was Father F. McCann, CM, a Vincentian priest, chaplain at Niagara University now stationed at the College Seminary of the Vincentian Fathers in Niagara Falls.

Father McCann addressed the question of the relevance of St. Vincent DePaul to the contemporary Charities' movement.
