

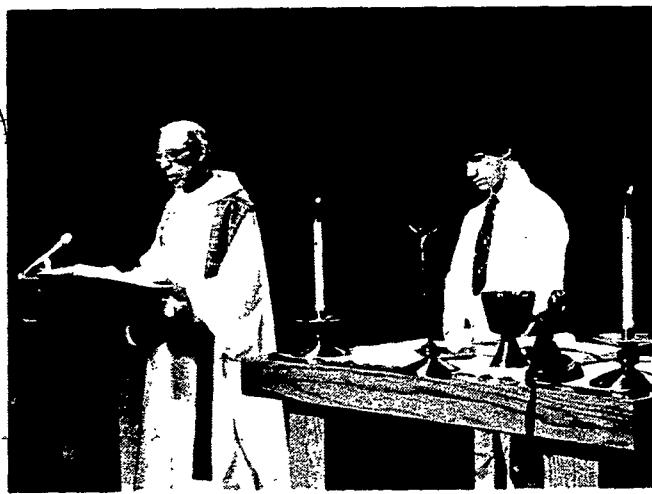
Combined Efforts Produce Popular Mass

The 8:30 a.m. Sunday televised Mass sponsored by the Basilian Fathers and the Daily Mass League is in its 27th year of broadcasting. Basilian priests from Aquinas Institute, St. John Fisher College, and Christ the King Church alternate Sundays with diocesan priests in saying the Mass. Fathers Joseph Moffatt, Aquinas principal, and Joseph Reinhart, director of diocesan Missions Office, are coordinators for the Basilians and diocesan priests respectively.

The televised Mass, from station WHEC (Channel 10), reaches an audience as far north as Ottawa and North Bay, Ontario, Canada, and south to Wellsville. It extends east and west to Liverpool, near Syracuse, and to Aurora.

FOCUS ON EUCHARIST

Father Dennis Bonsignore will lead the devotions for Focus on the Eucharist, 7:30 p.m., Thursday, Nov. 5, at the Sisters of St. Joseph Motherhouse Chapel. The rites include evening prayer, rosary, Mass, and exposition of the Blessed Sacrament.

A missalette is mailed from Aquinas periodically to 900 persons living within a radius of 200 miles from Rochester. Voluntary contributions make the program entirely self-supporting. Bishop Matthew H. Clark appears three times on the program during the year: Christmas, Easter and Mission Sunday.

The televised Mass had its

origin in 1969 while Father Leon Hart was principal at Aquinas, and it is presented as a public service by Channel 10. Personnel from WHEC-TV presently involved in its production are Bill Carroll, program director; Eddie Allen, director; and Mark Rand, production manager. The program is recorded in the studio on Monday for replay the following Sunday.

Liturgy Office Slates Workshop

"The Celebrating Community," the first of a two-part series of workshops focusing on the role of the worshiping assembly, has been scheduled by the Liturgy Office for 1:30 p.m. on Saturday, Nov. 14, at Keuka College in Penn Yan.

Hovda has served as staff member, editor and editorial director of the Liturgical Conference, Washington, D.C.; has authored "Dry Bones," "There Are Different Ministries," and "Strong, Loving and Wise: Presiding in Liturgy;" and has contributed sections to "The Liturgy Committee Handbook," "It Is Your Own Mystery," and "Touchstones for Liturgical Ministers."
