Sr. Theresa Aselin (De Pazzi), SSJ

Mass of Christian Burial for Sister Theresa Aselin (formerly Sister DePazzi), SSJ, was held at the Sisters of St. Joseph Motherhouse chapel Wednesday, Oct. 21. Sister Theresa died Oct. 19, 1981.

Father Richard Hart, a former pupil, was celebrant and homilist.

Sister Theresa was raised in Rochester and entered the convent from Blessed Sacrament Church in 1927. A graduate of Nazareth College, Sister Theresa served 41 years in diocesan parochial schools.

Among her assignments were Immaculate Conception, Rochester; St. John the Evangelist, Greece; St.

Augustine, Rochester; St. Joseph, Wayland; St. Stephen, Geneva; Mother of Sorrows, Rochester; Immaculate Conception, Ithaca; St. Mary, Canandaigua; St. Ambrose, Rochester; St. Casimir, Elmira; and Nazareth Hall cadet school.

She retired from teaching in 1970 and served for two years in the office at Blessed Sacrament School. In 1972, she retired to St. Joseph Convent and Infirmary on the motherhouse grounds.

Sister Theresa is survived by three sisters: Mary Aselin, Mrs. Robert (Helen) Kinney, and Sister Mary Bernadette, SSJ; and two brothers, Joseph and Donald.
