Father Eugene Matuszewski

Fairmount — More than 125 priests participated in the Oct. 22 Mass of Christian Burial for Father Eugene J. Matuszewski, former resident of Rochester, who died Oct. 19, 1981. Father Matuszewski was pastor of Holy Family Parish here, just west of Syracuse.

Born in Morris Run, Pa., Father Matuszewski and his family moved to Rochester in the late 20s. He attended St. Stanislaus School, Rochester; St. John Kanty High School, Erie, Pa.; St. Mary's College, Orchard Lake, Mich.; and St. Bernard's Seminary, Rochester. He was ordained May 15, 1947, for the Diocese of Syracuse, at Immaculate Conception Cathedral. He served assistant

pastorates at St. Mary's, Cleveland; Sacred Heart, Syracuse; St. Thomas, Binghamton; St. Margaret's, Mattydale; St. Casimir, Endicott and Most Holy Rosary, Syracuse.

He held the pastorates of St. Stephen's, Oswego, and Holy Family.

He is survived by two brother priests, Father Leo Matuszewski, pastor emeritus of St. Patrick's Church, Owego, and Msgr. Stanley Matuszewski, provincial of the LaSalette Fathers in Twin Lakes, Wis.; three other brothers, Valerian of Rochester, Bernard of Chicago, and Aloysius of Lake Worth, Fla.; a sister, Eugenia of Rochester, and several nieces and nephews.
