Sunday's Readings: (R3) Lk. 1:26-38. (R1) 2 Sm. 7:1-5, 8-12, 14, 16. (R2) Rom. 16:25-27.

The Church, year in and year out, celebrates the same seasons and feasts - Advent and Christmas, Lent and Easter. Why? Because, having ears, we hear not. It is one thing to hear and another to hear and understand! The Church seems to battologize, but she knows that repetition is the heart of understanding.

That is why it is not useless to repeat the old Christmas stories each year. One such story is that of The Other Wise Man. Repetition may one day teach us the lesson of Christmas: to give to others for the sake of Christ.

Wise Man was a Medean, Artaban. He set out to follow the star. He took with him a sapphire, a ruby and a pearl beyond price as gifts for the King. He was riding hard to meet his friends, Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar, at the agreed meeting place. The three were 600 miles away in Persia and promised to wait 10 days for Artaban to join them. If he were late, they would leave him, for the time was short.

Artaban rode fast to his tryst. On the tenth day when only a few hours away from



the meeting place, a poor man stricken with marsh begged Artaban for fever help. If Artaban stayed to help, he would be late. He did stay; he helped and healed the man.
