prostitution in exchange for an apartment.

81 L has finally left her alcoholic husband after 13 years of abuse. She is searching for a place to live and a new life for herself.

82 L has been trying to raise her three young children and to get an education at the same time. Her boyfriend recently destroyed her college textbooks as well as some library books. She and her children have left that apartment in search of a better living situation.

83 H has left her severely abusive husband. She is now suing for custody of their handicapped child.

84 F's parents threw her out of the family home. She is now trying to find work and to finish her high school education at the same time.

85 B was recently released from prison. She is 17 years old and is seeking both an apartment and work.

86 P is recovering from a nervous breakdown. She was living with relatives but found this environment too stressful. She has two young children. She is trying to find a better apartment on her limited budget.

87 H and her husband are deaf. They have, however, a two-year-old child who is hearing. The couple is having domestic problems as well as difficulty in finding schooling for their child so that he can learn to communicate with them and with other hearing persons.

88 M, 83, lives in a disadvantaged urban neighborhood. She is a proud woman who wishes to continue living in her home until she dies. However, she is constantly having problems with neighborhood vandalism to her property. She recently had to spend all of the money she had carefully saved from her fixed income to buy a hearing aid to replace her living room windows broken when someone threw rocks through them.

89 T lives alone and is in very poor health. He tries to remain independent, but this is very difficult because of his physical frailties. His wife is in a nursing home, so he often feels lonely and isolated. He lives very frugally on his limited income.

90 W is plagued with seizures and his wife has cerebral palsy. The couple recently had a baby. Although W is employed, he is unable to buy a full-size crib because of the numerous medical bills.

91 M, 38, is a working mother of five children, all younger than 10. Her husband is in prison, and on her small income she is trying to support her family. Since

she will not become involved with Social Services, she has to pay her own day care costs and supply all household needs.

92 B is 75. He lives alone in his small home which is badly in need of repair. His wife is dead and his only family is a drunken son. B has suffered great abuse from his son, who is now living away from home.

93 The Js are an elderly couple living in a shack in a rural area. Since they own the shack, they won't move. Their electricity and heat costs are very high in the winter. For a number of reasons beyond their control, they are desperately in need of money.

94 M is 14 years old, one of a family of 14 children. His family has always been involved with welfare and on this limited income, his mother is unable to provide for any holiday extras. He is presently attending a day treatment program and is having difficulty adjusting to the system.

95 The Ps are refugees from Haiti who have been in the area for about a year. Both have held minimum wage jobs, but Mrs. P was forced to stop working when her baby was born. The couple is saving money from P's meager wages to send back to relatives in Haiti.

96 R is a young Haitian trying to care for his young wife and child on the income from a part-time job, the only employment he has been able to find. He is industrious and is attending English classes in the hopes that this will help him find full-time employment.

97 J is the mother of six children. Her husband died of cancer at a young age, and she receives only Social Security. She has no employable skill with which to supplement her income.

98 D, in her late 50s, is disabled and alone. Her only income is from SSI, and she has become despondent and fearful about the economic situation, worrying that her government check will stop. She has no family on which to fall back.

99 A is 17 years old, and is enrolled in a special vocational program. The program, however, requires that she wear a uniform and special shoes, items which her poor family is unable to afford. She is ambitious and desirous of learning a trade so that she can both support herself and contribute to her family.

100 D, a deserted wife, struggles to support her three school-age children by working at an entry-level job. She cannot afford carfare, so she rides her bicycle to work. In spite of sacrifice and tight money management, she finds it nearly impossible to make her wages stretch to provide for her family.
