# Design Group for Ed. Board Debates Board's Role

The 12-member committee which has been working since last June designing a diocesan education board, is now in the process of defining the role, and the relationship of such a board to the bishop and the diocesan Division of Education, Sister Roberta Tierney, SSND, said last week.

She said that in the near future "members from the design committee will be in communication with the consultative bodies, regional coordinators, the Association of Religious Educators, Catholic school principals, and related groups. The purpose of this contact will be to give information about the direction in which the design is moving and to seek input and recommendations from various groups."

Since last June, Sister Roberta said, the committee has been deliberating about the type of board needed in the diocese. Advice was sought from national consultants who have worked with such groups for the past decade, she said; and the design and structure of such boards were collected from more than 12 dioceses.

"The call for a collegial body involved in setting educational direction and policy as found in the National Catechetical Directory and the pastoral 'To Teach as Jesus Did' was followed," Sister Roberta said.

"One of the first clarifications the committee made was that this board would be concerned for total religious education. It will be consultative to the Division of Education in examining needs and setting priorities for the educational ministries," Sister Roberta said.

## Red Cross Program Offered

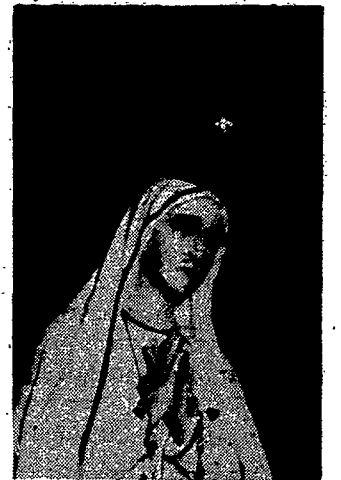
