Maplecrest, Star Team To Aid Polish Fund

Maplecrest Foods, in cooperation with Star Supermarkets, has announced a two-week campaign to raise funds for the stricken people of Poland.

Beginning Jan. 18, Maplecrest will donate 50 cents of the purchase price of each package of its Krakow brand sausage sold in Star markets to the Tribute to Poland Fund.

Money raised will be channeled through the diocese to the bishops of Poland. The campaign will be in effect the weeks of Jan. 18 and 25.

Maplecrest is locally owned and operated and was founded by the Zamiara family, whose butcher shop was a landmark in Rochester's Polish Town from the 30s through the 50s. Anthony Zamiara, president, said Krakow sausage was chosen because it is based on a distinct Polish recipe and because it is named after Rochester's sister city in Poland.

Maplecrest is sponsoring a similar campaign in Buffalo and hopes to have similar drives in other parts of New York and Pennsylvania.

The promotion is the first large-scale corporate donation to the local fundraising drive according to James Pula, of the Committee to Aid Poland.

'Consecrate Russia,' Cardinal Urges Pope

St. Louis (RNS) — Calling Russia's role in Poland "an affront which threatens world peace," retired Cardinal John J. Carberry of St. Louis says it's time for the pope and the world's bishops to make a dramatically symbolic move by "consecrating" the Soviet nation to the Virgin Mary.

The 77-year-old prelate issued a statement noting that "the consecration of Russia and the world is one of the

requests made to three children by the Blessed Virgin Mary during a series of apparitions at Fatima, Portugal, between May and October 1917."

This "collegial consecration of Russia," said the cardinal in his new statement, "would include all the bishops of the world joining with the pope in a simultaneous ceremony on a specific day."

project, the date of the move is still some time away. But Rev. Barclay took some time last month to publicly thank St. Mark's for all they had done, in a letter to the editor of the Greece Post.

"... This experience of meeting at St. Mark's, my personal fellowship with Father Donovan and the gift from St. Mark's Church are the most wonderful gestures across denominational lines that I have known in my 20 years in the Christian ministry

Father Donovan pointed out that his parish's actions across denominational barriers is not the first of its kind. He remembered that St. Mark's in Kendall used the Lutheran church there "for maybe nine years" before obtaining their own facility.

"But if Our Lord prayed for unity — and it must have been very important for Him to have prayed for it at the

time near His death — then we'll do everything we can on this end ecumenically."
