Although the juniors took an early lead, the seniors retaliated to win the day.

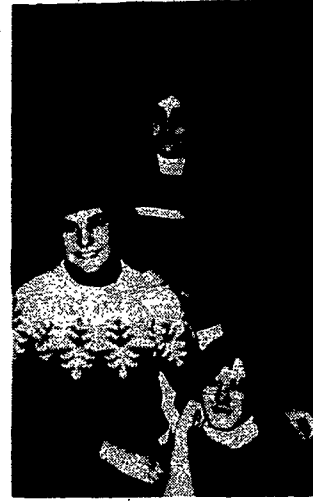
McQuaid Features the 'Fiddler'

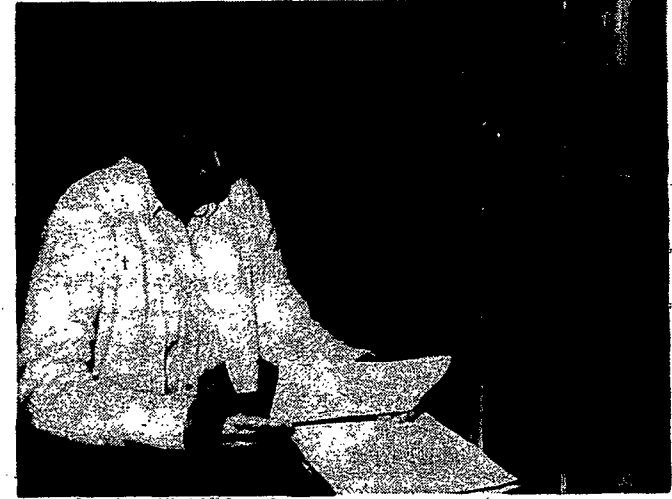
