Diocese Slates Workshops on Budget Cuts

The diocesan Department of Justice and Peace is sponsoring a series of workshops in the Monroe, Livingston, Cayuga and Ontario counties on the subject of the federal budget cuts and Catholic Social Teachings.

"Action steps and strategy for short-range and long-range involvement will be provided so that parishes can be organized to respond to the economic impact that federal budget transfers have had and will continue to have on our families, friends, neighbors and members of our communities," an announcement flier stated.

All in the Family

In Addition, Smokers Are Unkissable

Research scientists now tell us that 30 percent of all cancers are caused by cigarette smoking: cancers of the lung, kidney, bladder, pancreas and cervix are implicated in the report which came out this past week.

And the surgeon general has decided that what is needed are stronger warnings than those already carried on the side of cigarette packages.

I would have thought by now that the experts would have realized that fear of death is apparently not much of a deterrent to smokers. Those who puff away, down deep believe it'll be "the other guy, not me" who is affected.

Now, if the watchdogs of our nation's health really want to do something that'll make the smokers sit up and take notice, they'll print this on each and every cigarette package, cigar wrapper and chewing tobacco box: It has been determined that the use

of tobacco in any form leaves the user eminently unkissable. In addition, it stains the teeth, leaves the fingers yellow and makes the user's hair smell worse than a barnyard.

In addition, cigarette users have been known to burn holes in such places as baby blankets (with the baby inside), bed sheets and the backs of their own trousers or skirts. (The last happens when you are driving in a strong wind with the window down.)

Will such a warning do any good? Who knows? It might. The chances are pretty good that it'll make more of an impression than the threat carried now. And I ought to know — I've been there.

Tuition Forms Available

Sister Edwardine Weaver, superintendent of Schools for the Diocese of Rochester, announced that the diocese would be offering tuition subsidies for the 1982-83 school year in two areas: for students attending a Catholic secondary school, and for students attending a Catholic elementary school.

The purpose of the subsidy program is to help the economically disadvantaged child who wishes to receive a Catholic education but otherwise could not afford to do so.

Information and application forms for these programs are available as follows:

Secondary Tuition Subsidy: forms available at each Catholic high school as of March 1.

Elementary Tuition Subsidy: forms available at each Catholic elementary school and parish as of March 1.

Acceptance and registration at a Catholic school is required before application can be made.

Applications and re-applications are to be completed and returned to the school by the middle of April and awards will be announced in June.

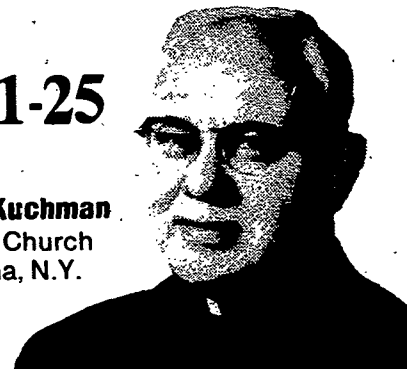
