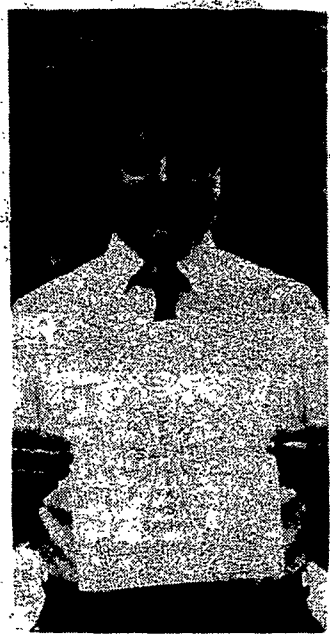
## St. John
