Want a Summer Job? Better Get a Number

According to Social Security sources, young people planning to work this summer for the first time need to apply for a Social Security number.

When you apply for one, you must furnish evidence of your date of birth, identity, and U.S. citizenship or lawful admission status. You must apply in person if you are 18 or older and have never had a Social Security number.

Best proof of age and U.S. citizenship is a birth certificate or church record that shows the date and place of birth. Other documents that can be used to prove age and citizenship include certificates of naturalization and U.S. passports. Those who need a duplicate Social Security card to replace a lost one or to show a new

name must also provide evidence of identity.

If you have any questions call the Social Security office at 263-6200. You can also visit the office between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. Remember, it takes time to obtain a Social Security number and many employers will not hire a person without it.

Service Awards Given

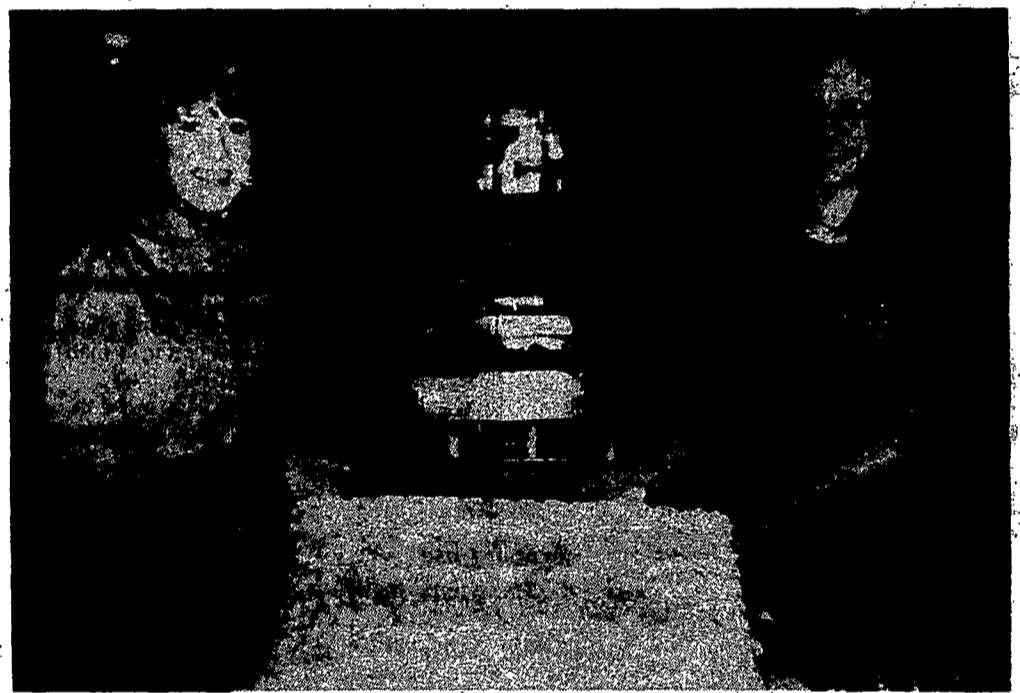
