Father McNamara said the citation also states that "St. Bernard's Institute would dishonor itself if it failed to honor this distinguished alumnus and former professor of St. Bernard's Seminary."

Masters degrees in divinity were conferred on three candidates for the priesthood: Rev. Mr. Robert Scott Bourcy, Diocese of Rochester; Rev. Mr. Richard Ambrose Severson, Diocese of Albany; and Rev. Mr. James Edward Willsey, Diocese of Rochester. A masters degree in theology was granted to Mrs. Maribeth Norsen Mancini.

Retroactive masters degrees in divinity were given to several alumni of St. Bernard's Seminary as well. The recipients were Father William J. Amann, Robert G. Magin, Father James Joseph Fallon (Diocese of Syracuse), John Gormley, Father Stanley E. Hastillo (Diocese of Hartford), and Msgr. Thaddaeus Felix Malanowski

(Diocese of Norwich), Father McNamara said.

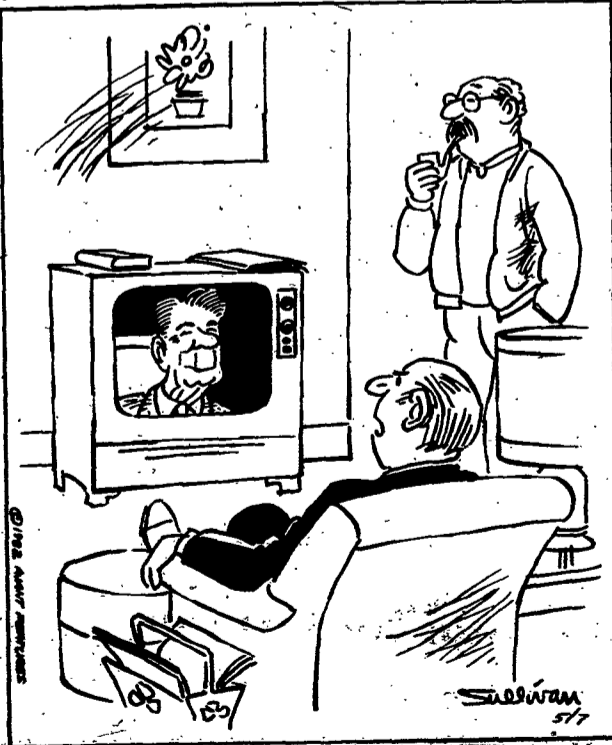
