## Science Wonders To Be Displayed

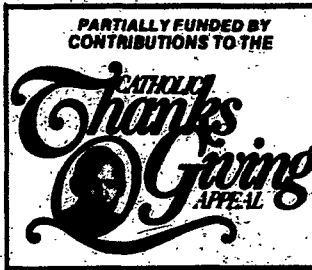
St. John Fisher College will host the 11th annual Science Exploration Day, Wednesday and Thursday, May 26-27. More than 5,000 people are expected to attend the two-day event, which will begin at 9:45 a.m. on Wednesday, May 26. That evening, from 6:30 to 9:30 p.m., the 50 science exhibitions on display from area businesses, colleges, high

schools, government agencies and students will be open to public viewing, free of charge.

With this year's theme "Excitement of Physics," SUNY Brockport associate professors Richard V. Mancuso, Ph.D., physics, and Kenneth D. Schlecht, Ph.D., chemistry, will perform a series of demonstrations in tandem to illustrate that the same laws are exhibited in both chemistry and physics. Their lecture/demonstration will be titled "Explorations into the Beauty and Unity of Chemistry and Physics," and will begin at 8:15 p.m., Thursday, May 27, in Fisher's Science Building, S-141.

Sponsored by the Central Western Section Science Teachers Association of New York, Science Exploration Day is held to educate the public regarding recent scientific achievements; to demonstrate the importance of science in our community; to provide an awareness of career opportunities in the sciences; to disseminate basic scientific information in the areas of health, the environment, technology and the natural and physical sciences; and to create an awareness of the need for science education at all levels.
