The Discalced Carmelite Nuns of 1931 W. Jefferson Road will celebrate the Golden Jubilee of the first novice to receive the habit in the Rochester Carmel May 26. Sister Joseph of the Infant Jesus (Veronica Collins) is the jubilarian.

Bishop Joseph L. Hogan, former Bishop of Rochester, will be the chief celebrant of a Jubilee Mass at 9:30 a.m. He will be joined at the altar by a number of priests including Father Patrick Caverly of Orlando, Fla., a cousin of the Carmelite. In addition, many relatives from both Rochester and her native Massachusetts are expected and all friends of the monastery are invited to the event.

Sister Joseph, eighth of nine children, was born and grew up in Lawrence, Mass. While studying nursing at St. Elizabeth's Hospital in Boston, she experienced a vocation to life as a Carmelite. At the suggestion of the prioress of the Boston Carmel, she applied to the new Carmel in Rochester, founded by the same Mother Beatrix who had founded the Boston group some 40 years earlier.

In an unusual turn of events, the young woman traveled to Rochester to find that she had as many relatives in this area as she did in her native New England.

From the community's first days, Sister Joseph has taken an active part in its growth and in its moves, first to an East Avenue house, and later to the present monastery.

She will receive visitors in the "speakroom" immediately after Mass on Wednesday, and 9-10 a.m. and 3-4 p.m. Friday and Saturday, May 28 and 29.
