# **Diocesans Asked to Help In Soviet Emigre Issue**

By John Dash Catholics across the diocese were asked last week to write letters to President Reagan on behalf of Tatiana Lozansky and her daughter Tania, asking his intervention in their attempts to leave the Soviet Union.

Tatiana, the wife of University of Rochester and Nazareth College professor Edward Lozansky, has been on a hunger strike in the Soviet Union to draw attention to her plight since May 10.

The plea was brought to. diocesan attention last week Lozansky's parents bv Michael (Dmitri) and Dina Lozansky and Rabbi Judah Miller, who said that the case cuts across both political and religious lines. "We simply want to reunite this family, he said.

Father Charles Mulligan, diocesan director of Social Ministries, agreed, saying, "The Russians are not respecting their earlier agreement (to allow Tatiana to leave the USSR to join her

this family. We want to remind the president that any peace talks start by respecting the basic unit of Church and society, the family.

Earlier, Lozansky and his parents were allowed to emigrates and it was understood that his wife and daughter would soon follow. His wife, however, is the daughter of Soviet three star general Ivan Dmitrievich Yershov, and it is thought here that he is blocking her move.
