Diocesans Asked to Help In Soviet Emigre Issue

Catholics across the diocese were asked last week to write letters to President Reagan on behalf of Tatiana Lozansky and her daughter Tania, asking his intervention in their attempts to leave the Soviet Union.

Tatiana, the wife of University of Rochester and Nazareth College professor Edward Lozansky, has been on a hunger strike in the Soviet Union to draw attention to her plight since May 10.

Lozansky's mother said last week that her son calls her every week from Washington, D.C., where he is working temporarily, to appeal to the Rochester community for support for his cause.

The plea was brought to diocesan attention last week by Lozansky's parents Michael (Dmitri) and Dina Lozansky and Rabbi Judah Miller, who said that the case cuts across both political and religious lines. "We simply want to reunite this family," he said.

major superior of the diocesan Sisters of Mercy, is "living proof of what the Spirit is doing in the Churches": to speak about the urgent need for peace and nuclear disarmament.

own conversion for a future that will demand a deep spirituality and bonding that will enable us to continue working for peace... Our corporate response to stand with women religious from all over the country on Pentecost will be a powerful breath of the Spirit to 'renew the face of the earth.'"

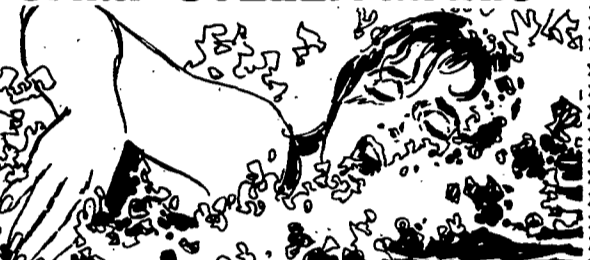
phasize the single's importance in the life of the Church, and their vital contribution to the world as Christians, as men and women, and as singles," Mrs. Schaeffer said.
