

Bishop Hogan among Celebrants Varied Careers Mark 40th Anniversary Class

The ordination class of 1942 has among its members a bishop and a foreign missionary.

Six, including Bishop Joseph L. Hogan, were ordained June 6, 1942 at Sacred Heart by Bishop James E. Kearney. The seventh was ordained June 16 that year.

The priests are Father Henry F. Adamski, Father Thomas K. Cleary, Father Joseph M. Egan, Father Clarence W. Gardner, Father Paul J. Gibbons and Father John D. Hurley, a former missionary in the Philippines.

Bishop Hogan is a native of Lima, where he attended St. Rose School and Lima High School before entering St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's seminaries.

He served at St. Mary's, Elmira, as professor of Latin and Social Studies at St. Andrew's; as a teacher at Canisius College, Buffalo; as principal, De Sales High School, Geneva; as professor of Fundamental Dogma at St. Bernard's Seminary; professor of Theology at St. John Fisher College; professor of Ascetical Theology at St. Joseph Novitiate; rector of Becket Hall; pastor of St. Margaret Mary Church, Irondequoit, prior to his ordination as bishop Nov. 28, 1969.

During his career he also

earned degrees from Canisius College, and the Pontifical University Angelicum, Rome.

He retired Nov. 28, 1978.

Nearly a week of celebration will mark his anniversary. Mass will be celebrated at 5 p.m., June 5, at his home parish of St. Rose in Lima. A public reception will follow. The bishop will celebrate Mass at 9 a.m., the day following at St. Patrick's in Victor followed by a brunch and a private gathering. He will celebrate Mass at noon, Tuesday, June 8, at the Pastoral Office; and a dinner will follow. St. Patrick's Parish will throw a parish dinner in the bishop's honor Wednesday, June 9.

Father Adamski, pastor of St. Casimir's Church in Elmira, is a native of Rochester where he attended St. Stanislaus School, Benjamin Franklin High School and St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's seminaries.

He has served at St. Stanislaus, Rochester; St. John's, Clyde-St. Patrick's, Savannah; St. Stanislaus, Bradford; St. Joseph's, Campbell, prior to being named pastor at St. Casimir's.

He and his classmate and associate pastor, Father Joseph M. Egan will concelebrate a Jubilee Mass at 11 a.m., June 6. An adult reception and dinner will follow in the school hall.

Father Cleary, pastor at Holy Cross in Freeville and chaplain to the George Junior Republic there, studied at Corpus Christi School, St. Andrew's Seminary, Notre Dame University, and St. Bernard's Seminary.

He served at St. Francis of Assisi, Rochester; and St. Patrick's, Corning, prior to being named, in 1950, pastor in Freeville.

Father Cleary will preside at a concelebrated Mass at 4

p.m., Sunday, June 6. The Mass will be preceded by a parish family reception starting at 2 p.m. Cocktails and dinner will follow the Mass at 6 p.m., in Ewald Dining Hall at George Junior Republic.

Father Egan, a native of Elmira, studied at St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's seminaries, at the North American College in Rome, Italy, and at St. Mary of the Lake Seminary Mundelein, Ill. He was ordained June 16. He received a doctorate in Sacred Theology in 1943 from the last-named school.

The following year he was named professor of Dogmatic Theology at St. Bernard's Seminary, a post he held until 1966 when he was named pastor of St. Patrick's, Elmira. He relinquished his pastorate ten years later, and has taken a post at St. Casimir's in Elmira.

Although he will join in the celebration for Father Adamski, Father Egan will eschew a personal observance of the anniversary.

Father Gardner, pastor of St. Alphonsus in Auburn is a native of Rochester. He attended Holy Redeemer and St. Ambrose schools, Aquinas Institute, and St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's seminaries.

He has served at Our Lady of Lourdes, Elmira; Our Lady of Good Counsel, Rochester; St. Alphonsus, Auburn; St. Anthony's, Rochester; St. Dominic's, Shortsville, and Holy Rosary, Rochester. In 1959, he was named Catholic chaplain at Auburn Prison and chaplain to Mercy Hospital, posts he held until 1978 and his Auburn pastorate. During his years in Auburn, Father Gardner also has served as director of Camp Columbus and chaplain to the Columbian Squires.

Father Gardner will celebrate Mass at 2 p.m.,



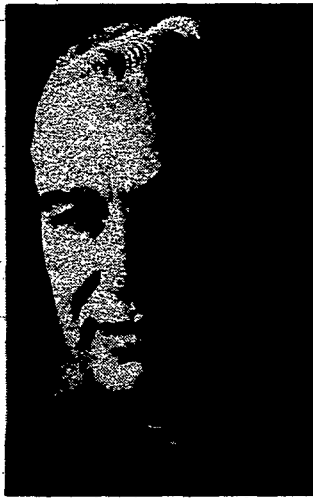

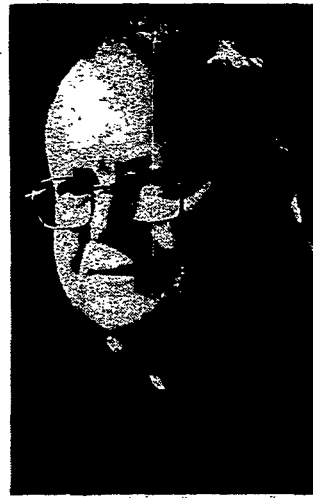

Sunday, June 6. A reception will follow in the parish center. Cocktails and dinner will be served at 5 p.m., at the Holiday Inn.

Father Gibbons is a Rochester native who attended Holy Rosary School, St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's seminaries, and St. Bonaventure University, where he earned a masters degree in Ancient Classics.

The associate pastor of St. Ann's, Hornell, has served at St. Monica's, Rochester, as Latin professor at St. Andrew's and later King's Prep; as pastor of Our Lady of Victory, Rochester; at St. Michael's, Penn Yan; and St. Casimir's, Elmira. He has been at his present post since 1978.

Father Gibbons will celebrate a Mass at noon on June 6, and a reception will follow until 3 p.m. in the school hall.

Father Hurley is a Waverly native who attended the public grammar and high schools there. Prior to his ordination, he studied at St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's seminaries.

He has served here at Holy Rosary, Rochester; St. John the Evangelist, Spencerport; and Our Lady of Lourdes, Elmira. In 1949 he entered the Air Force as a chaplain and served with the 307th Bomb Group. His service in the Far East included a tour of duty in Okinawa. He was in the service until 1957, when he

asked Bishop James E. Kearney's permission to join a group of ex-chaplains doing missionary work in the Philippines. In 1968, word was received that his mission was seriously damaged in an earthquake. He returned from the Philippines in 1972. With the permission of Bishop Joseph L. Hogan, Father Hurley returned to active duty with the Air Force. He retired his commission in 1979, and settled in Alexandria, Va., and though retired, pursues and active ministry.

He will celebrate a Mass at 11 a.m., Sunday, June 6 at the Carmelite Monastery on Jefferson Road. A private gathering will follow at the home of his brother.

The priests and their anniversary dates are: Father Raymond Booth, June 8; Father Thomas D. Hctor, June 8; Father William A. Trott, June 8; and Father Thomas Watts, June 15. They were all ordained by Bishop Lawrence Casey.

Father Booth has been pastor of St. Christopher's in North Chili since 1975. He has previously served at St. Mary's, Ontario; St. Joseph's, Penfield; Holy Family, Rochester; and Mt. Carmel, Rochester.

Father Hctor has been Catholic chaplain at the Rochester Psychiatric Center since 1978. He has served at St. Thomas the Apostle, St. James, St. Andrew's Seminary, Nazareth College, St. John Fisher College, as chaplain at the University of Rochester, and at St. Louis in Pittsford.

Father Trott, pastor of St.

Augustine's Church, has served at St. Joseph's, Wayland; St. Francis of Assisi, Rochester; St. Margaret Mary's, Irondequoit; and St. Bernard's Seminary. In addition he has served as diocesan director of the Legion of Mary, and as executive director of the Priests' Spirituality Committee.

Father Watts, co-pastor of St. Patrick's, Owego, has previously served at St. Mary's, Corning; St. Rita's, West Webster; St. Charles Borromeo, Elmira Heights; and St. Patrick's, Mt. Morris. He was named to his present co-pastorate in 1973.

Father Booth and Sister Marie Brown, SSI, religious education coordinator, will both be feted at a party 8-11 p.m., Friday, June 12, in the gym of the neighboring parish, St. Pius Tenth. Sister Marie also is celebrating her silver anniversary this year.

The day following, a reception will be held after the 11:30 a.m. Mass. Admission to the June 12 party, a spokesperson for the parish said, is by presentation of an hors d'oeuvre.

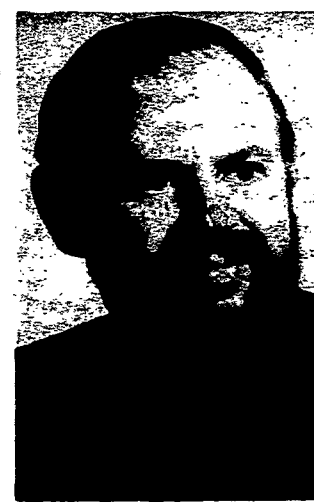

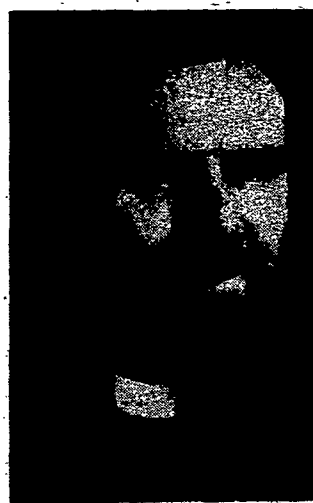

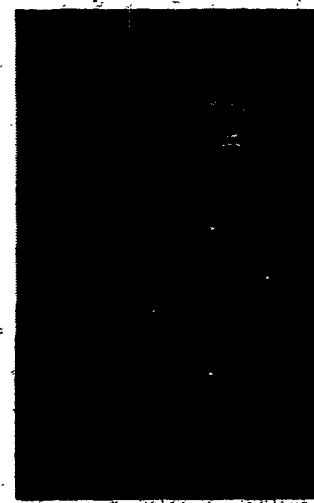
