

Parish Urges End To Reaganomics

The Human Development Committee of Sacred Heart Cathedral parish has passed a resolution calling for an end to further budget cuts in social programs by the federal government.

The resolution declares that the 1982 U.S. budget "cut \$35 billion from human service programs while military spending was increased \$44 billion and ... the total proposed federal budget for fiscal year 1983 is \$750 billion, less than \$80 billion targeted specifically for the poor."

"Catholics are called by their Lord and Savior Jesus Christ to answer the cries of the poor," the resolution continues.

Therefore, the committee "calls upon its U.S." representatives and senators to work against further cuts in programs specifically aimed at. assisting the poorest people of our nation, especially Aid to Families with Dependent Children, Food Stamps, Medicaid, Low-Income Housing, Employment and Training and Human Services for the Poor."
