Tough Start For Visit To Ireland

May is a good time to go to Ireland. The weather is usually good. Baby lambs and sheep and cattle dot the 40 shades of green pastures. Miles of tough golden furze or gorse swathe miles of country hedges. Daylight lasts until nearly 10 p.m. The trek of visitors is just beginning.

On May 11, 21 persons from the diocese gathered for a 10-day tour to Ireland. From tiny Honeoye Lake: Mrs. Mary Houck of St. Mary's, and her friend, Miss Ruth Sweemer of the Lutheran Church of the Resurrection, Irondequoit; from Dansville: Mrs. Roxy Moyer, organist at St. Mary's, and the distinguished barrister, Miss Helen Pratt; Savannah: Mrs. Ann Davy, who was also on our October Kenya trip; Batavia: Mrs. Dorothy Little of the First Presbyterian Church, with roots in Caledonia; from Rochester: Mrs. Kay King of St. Charles, and her sister, Bernice Bryant of St. Helen's; Mr. and Mrs. Frank Casey of Sacred Heart Cathedral, and their daughter, Mrs. Eleanor Chilbert, now of St. Rose.

And from Clay: Mrs. Mary Kleinhans of St. Charles, a great friend of 'Mr. Aquinas," Bill Mc-Carthy, who had planned to join us but the Lord took him last March instead; Mrs. Mary Louise Garvin of St. John's, Greece, formerly of Good Counsel; Mrs. Rita Corder, also of St. John's, the energetic president of the parish "50 and Up Club:" Miss Catherine Ferris of Our Lady of Victory and St. Joseph's on Pleasant Street; Emmett Hennessy of Mother of Sorrows: Father Raymond G. Heisel, my classmate, also of Mother of Sorrows; and finally: Mrs. Margaret Pollinger of St. Ignatius; Hornell: former Rochester fire chief John Hurley and his wife, Irene, now of Lake Helen, Fla., and St. Joseph's, Lyndonville, both enthusiastic

We had a hard beginning. Matt Nolan, our thirtyish coach master, loaded us at Shannon and off we went to the Grand Dame of all Irish hotels, Great Southern, Killarney. After settling in. a

rest, and a fine dinner at 8 p.m., we were escorted to the auditorium next door to the hotel for the Cabaret: Irish singing and humor. An attraction for us is that Irish humor is uproariously funny but wholesome enough to bring a motherhouse of nuns to it. Everyone was in high humor after it.

But at 3 a.m. my phone rang. It was Michael Prosney, 24-year-old assistant manager. "Mr. Hennessy is in the lounge and may be having a heart attack. I have called the doctor." I hustled to the lounge.

A Dr. O'Donovan and I arrived at the same time. Emmett Hennessy was sitting calmly. "I've had this pain near my heart since midnight and just came down here. It may be only indigestion." Dr. O'Donovan examined him, then phoned for an ambulance from Tralee, of the Rose of Tralee fame, 25 miles away, I always bring the Holy Oils with me, and annointed E.H., who said, "Thank you. I am glad to have the sacraments." Then I told Dr. O'D., "I just annointed Mr. Hennessy." The doctor is a large man who speaks with an explosive vigor. He roared, "Damn good thing to do! Had another this morning."

Later that morning while our group did the Ring of Kerry, Mike Rosney took me to Bon Secours Hospital in Tralee. It has 72 beds with a staff which includes 20 Sisters. I talked with E.H. in intensive care, and with the nurses, three Sisters and finally a fine Dr. O'Regan, in his mid-40s who had practiced for some years in St. Louis, Dr. O'D. has said, "He's a good heart man. Practiced in America, but whether he or his wife got lonesome for Ireland, they returned. Fine doctor." Dr. O'Regan said, "The attack is bad enough to require careful attention. He'll need at least three weeks to be safe. Here is my phone number. Call me anytime you wish around midnight.'

We were all greatly reassured, and I phoned night E.H.'s three daughters, with great difficulties. got emergency passports and flew to Ireland and were with him when we returned to the states on May 22, a comfort for all of us to know he was in good hands.
