Sister Ellen Teresa Connelly, SSJ

Mass of Christian Burial was offered June 3 for Sister Ellen Teresa who died Tuesday, June 1, 1982. The rites were conducted by Msgr. William H. Shannon. Other priests present were Fathers Albert Ryan and Peter Bayer.

Sister Ellen Teresa was born in Richmond Hill and entered the Sisters of St. Joseph from St. Cecilia's Parish, Elmira, in 1923. She graduated St. Joseph's Hospital School of Nursing that same year.

She served actively in the nursing profession until 1966. For 32 years she held a number of posts at St. Joseph's, and an additional 13 years as apostolic visitor to patients there. She also served six years at St. Ann's Home and three years at the

congregation's infirmary. She retired from active service in 1979.

She was cited by her congregation as "a very competent nurse and supervisor, but more than that, a woman of great compassion for the suffering — whether those suffering be the sick or the poor, the lonely, the unbefriended. Many were the occasions when, after a hard day's work, she would spend the greater part of the night with a dying patient."

Sister Ellen Teresa is survived by two sisters, Sister Immaculata Connelly, SSJ, and Mrs. Helen (Nellie) Grace of Elmira; and several nieces and nephews.

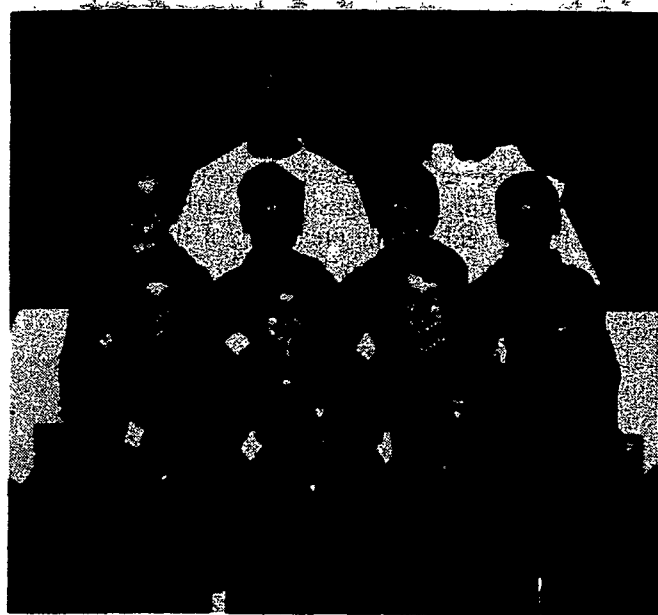
Sister St. James was a native of Spencerport and attended Nazareth Academy and Nazareth College.

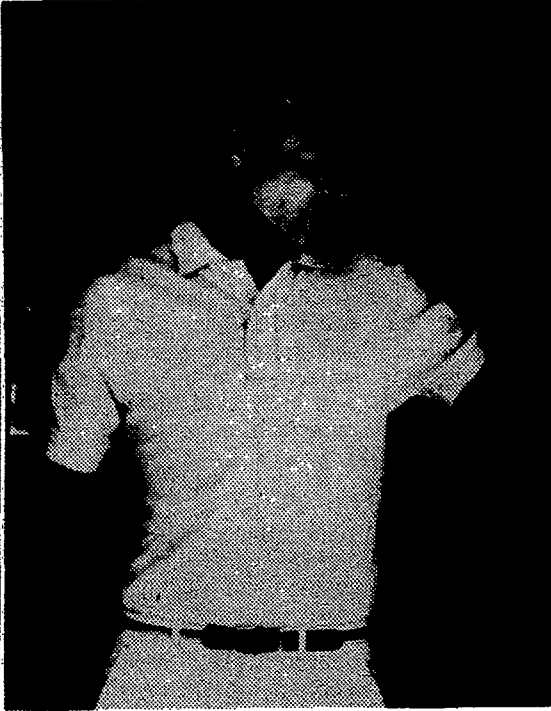
