

17 Major Addresses Planned at Seminar

Father Charles Mulligan, diocesan director of Social Ministries, will present one of the 17 major addresses at the National Lay Ministry Seminar July 11-15 at the Notre Dame Retreat House in Canadiagua.

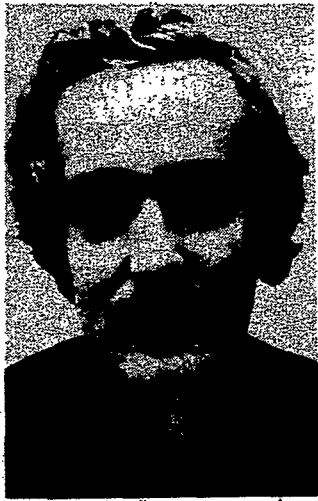
He will speak on "Social Justice in the Church." His talk will follow the address by Bishop Joseph L. Hogan on "The Vision of Lay Ministry in the Church of the 80s."

Other speakers include Frank and Sue Staropoli of the Office of Family Life who will present "The Vision and Strategy of Family Life Ministry," using in part the models of ministry from the National Conference of Catholic Bishops.

Father Robert Kennedy, director of the Department of Continuing Education at St. Bernard's Institute, will speak on "The Theology of Lay Ministry" and the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults.

Fred and Bette Brown, active in hunger programs and parish renewals, will speak on "Values and Lifestyle," evaluating attitudes on materialism.

An intensive process approach, "Spiritual Gifts Workshop," will be presented by Sister Nancy DeRycke, director of Religious Education at Fairport

Resurrection parish, and Robert and Deborah Zeman of St. Paul's in Webster.

Father John Mulligan, pastor of St. Stephen's in Geneva, will speak on "Lay Spirituality," touching on openness to the negative and positive approaches to spirituality.

"The Impact of Culture on Families" will be the topic of Sister Patricia Frisk, program coordinator of the Webster Avenue Family Resource Center, and Ron and Judy Platten. They will discuss the effects of stress, divorce, drug

and alcohol abuse, poverty and technology on family life.

The Plattens, national directors of the Parenthood Center, sponsors of the seminar, will talk on four other topics: "Understanding Self," "Parallels between Ministry and Parenting Methods," "The Concept of Love," and "Broken Relationships."

Duncan and Elaine Montgomery of Assumption in Fairport will speak on "Relationship;" and Bill and Ollie McHugh of St. Pius X in Chili will present "Communication Techniques."

Father Edward Palumbos, co-pastor of Good Shepherd in Henrietta, will speak on "Conscience Formation."

"Parish-centered Lay Ministry" will be the topic of Father Robert C. Kreckel, pastor of Resurrection in Fairport. Tim and Roni Weider, staff counselors at the Craig Developmental Center, will discuss "Counseling Techniques."

Nine mini-presentations offer tangible choices to those interested in many aspects of ministry and augments the "Spiritual Gifts Workshop." These sessions will be given by

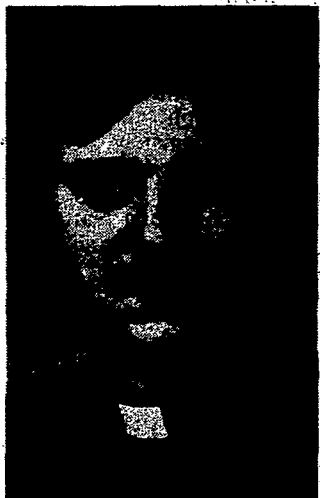
