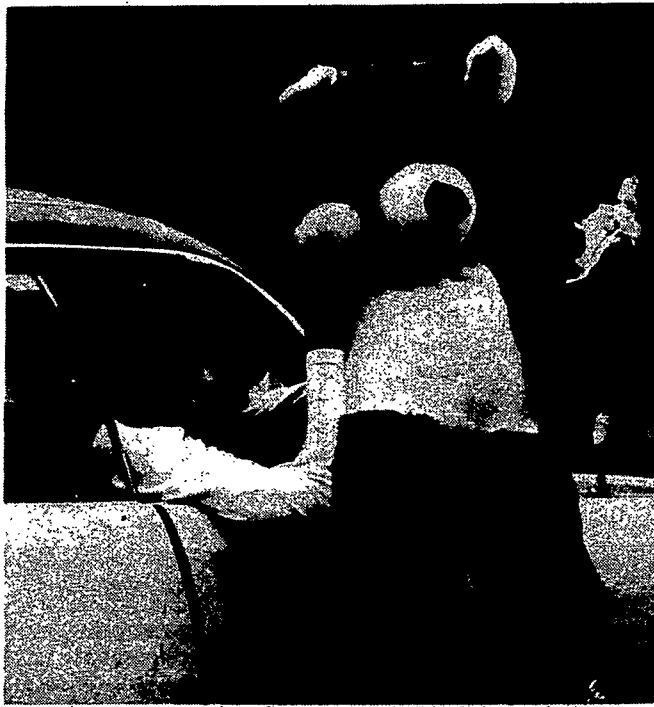




Moving Day

Bishop Hogan Addresses New Charities Board

Bishop Joseph L. Hogan looked over the small congregation made up mostly of laymen and said, "The good leader says to the people, 'You have gifts to offer.'"

The former bishop of Rochester then called forth those gifts at an unusual ceremony, commissioning the new board of trustees for the diocesan Catholic Charities.

The bishop, looking fit and relaxed, presided at the candlelight rites at the Cenacle Center for Spiritual Renewal.

In his address, the bishop stated that power struggles have been an evil in the Church from the very beginning, and warned the new trustees not to engage in them.

Rather, he said, the Charities' leaders should strive to develop such a community

that others repeat what had been said of the early Christians, "See how they love one another."

He also said that there is temptation for anyone in social services to begin looking upon people needing help as case numbers.

The bishop pointed out that Jesus "never cured people as a group." Instead, He treated people individually.

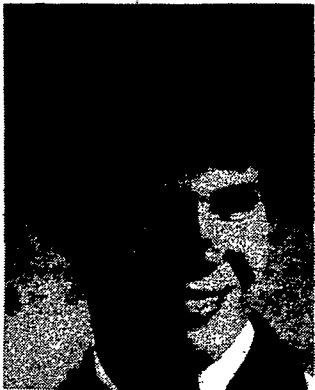
The bishop further cautioned the new trustees not to think of themselves as important solely from their position as trustees.

He related that as a younger priest he was taught that lesson by a grave digger in his hometown of Lima. The laborer, Bart Hayes, he quoted as saying: "You know, you have your work and I have my work. Every grave must be so wide, and so deep. And in Lima we have all sorts of soils. . . . And the shovel has

to respond to the different kinds of soils."

"He was a man who had a sense of his own worth and work, and had joy in doing his work," the bishop said.
