Sister Dorothy Ellen Muldoon

Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated June 26 for Sister Dorothy Ellen Muldoon who died at 55, Wednesday, June 23, 1982.

The Sister of St. Joseph was

known throughout the diocesan community for her positive dealing with the illness which finally claimed her life. In the past year and a half, Sister Dorothy Ellen had six major operations and

extensive programs of radiation and chemotherapy for cancer. She was able to turn two mastectomies and the complete loss of her hair into occasions for humor and inspiration. "She maintained a positive outlook — no self-pity. She was an inspiration to

innumerable people. She was gracious and full of humor," her friend Sister Joan McDowell said last week.

An Auburn native, Sister Dorothy Ellen attended St. Alphonsus School and Holy Family High School there.

She studied at Good Counsel College in White Plains and graduated from Nazareth College in Rochester. In addition, she earned advanced degrees from the University of Notre Dame, the University of Pittsburgh and SUNY Brockport.

She entered her congregation in 1945. During her ministerial career, Sister Dorothy Ellen served at St. Anthony's, Elmira; St. Elizabeth's Mission, Selma, Ala.; Corpus Christi, Rochester; St. John the Evangelist, Greece; and St. Agnes High School and Nazareth Academy.

She served five terms on the Diocesan Sisters Council where she was known as an indefatigable champion for social justice issues. She also served as that body's liaison to the Priests Council, and was a member of the Rochester Association of Catholic School Principals.

An active sportswoman, Sister Dorothy Ellen particularly enjoyed cross-country skiing and ice skating.

She is survived by her mother, Mrs. Ruth Muldoon of Green Knolls Drive; a sister, Mrs. Robert (Marian) McMullen of Cohasset, Mass.; two brothers, William Muldoon of Rockville, Md., and Dr. Paul Muldoon of Fairfax Station, Va.; and several nieces and nephews.

Joseph G. Reichart

Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated June 15 at St. Cecilia's Church for Joseph G. Reichart who died Friday, June 11, 1982, after an illness of eight weeks.

Father Bernard Newcomb presided at the Mass. Other priests present were Father Robert Bradler, Father Francis Feeney, Father Joseph Hogan, Father Michael Hogan, Father William Green, CM, of Niagara University; Father Thomas O'Keefe, homilist; and Father Francis Pegnam. Also present were Father Anthony Valente and Father John Dillon.

Mr. Reichart was a produce dealer and longtime resident of Irondequoit. He and his wife moved to Geneseo several years ago. Here, they

were members of St. Salome, St. Margaret Mary and Christ the King parishes, and operated the Ridgecrest Grocery Store.

Mr. Reichart was a member and past president of the Point Pleasant Volunteer Firemen's Association and its marching band; he participated in the Pea Pickers Emergency Squad Drills; was a member of the Nightstick Club of Irondequoit, and received an award from Monroe County as a member of the United States Civilian Protection Organization during World War II.

In an event celebrated by both the families involved and by the community at large, he married Helen Klem in a double ceremony in which his

sister, Leona, married his bride's brother, Leo. The 1926 event was recalled 50 years later when the couples posed with Msgr. George Eckl for a photograph. Msgr. Eckl was the priest who had witnessed their vows.

Mr. Reichart is survived by three daughters, Mrs. Eugene (Joan) Erbin of Salt Lake City, Utah, Sister Mary Dominic, RSM, and Sister Jacquelyn, RSM; six grandchildren, Eugene of Sacramento, Calif., Lisa of Atlanta, Ga., and Thomas, Jacquelyn, Joseph and Joan, all of Salt Lake City; two sisters, Elvira Miller of Ontario, and Leona Klem of Rochester; several in-laws, cousins, nieces and nephews.

In recent years, Mr. Reichart was a member of St. Joseph's Parish, Livonia.
