Viewpoint: Sisters Reflect

Drawing A Picture Of God

A few years ago, my little niece handed me a crayon and asked me to draw her a picture of God. I told her I would have to think about that ... and I'm still thinking...

To create anything is, in a sense, to "draw God." That same power of life that flows from the hand of the Creator gives potential to my artistic endeavors. At times art and prayer merge and overlap, bonding the creative medium with the message of the Word. Art acquires a sacramental dimension, bringing an awareness of God's presence into sharper focus in my life. Regardless of subject matter, the very process of "making art" becomes a reflective experience. Symbolic images especially allow me to search beneath the surface of things to discover new levels of expression which gradually reveal a continuously creative God. Scripture is rich with an iconography of the Divine.

In reflective moments, I can view the world within the context of faith. The intricate simplicity of nature gives constant witness to the limitless possibilities of the Divine Creator. The changing seasons enhance the patterns of liturgical life. In the stark, barren trees of wintery advent I await in hope for His coming. The timid tender shoots of springtime speak to me of renewal and resurrection.

But even in the midst of creative activity there is struggle and discouragement. Sometimes like seeds planted in the dark earth, ideas must germinate and grow unseen before maturing. I redraw ideas again and again until they are integrated and whole. With the prophet Jeremiah, I often stand at the threshold of the potter's house. I see him patiently shaping and reshaping the clay vessels. I see the Divine potter forming and molding the directions of my life. In the pliant clay centered on the spinning wheel, I perceive the necessity to center my work in Christ. As the potter controls the clay to raise and lower the sides of his pottery, so the Master Potter forms in me a rhythm of dying and rising in the pulse of His paschal life. The message Jeremiah sought in the potter's house is the same today as it was then:

"Can I not do to you what this potter does? — it is Yahweh who speaks. Yes, as clay is in the potter's hand, so you are in Mine." (Jer. 18:5-6)

It is in the integration of art and prayer that I meet my Creator. In translating the verbal images of scripture into visual ones, I begin to recognize the presence of a God-with-us. The paper is still blank. I still don't know how to draw God. Perhaps all is God; perhaps nothing is God.
