

The summer months do not really lend themselves to starting anything unless it might be a good book. For parish liturgy teams this period of time is usually time off from the hurried and sometimes hectic preparations made, for each Sunday's celebration of Eucharist and the bare minimum of planning is done. Meetings are cancelled and team members have the opportunity to renew and refresh themselves before beginning again. Though the difficulties of operating a h liturgy team

exercise for parish liturgy teams is reviewing the past year. What did we accomplish? How did we fall short? Ask these questions not only of preparations made for liturgical celebrations but also of the growth and development of the team members and of the parish community.

Besides doing what has to be done to insure good Sunday celebrations, what could liturgy teams be doing these months? One thing certainly that these small groups should be doing is strengthening their sense of togetherness.
