

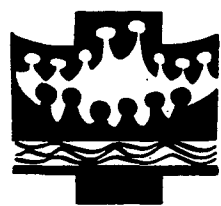

## Insights In Liturgy

## Attention, Pastoral Musicians!

People from every walk of life need someone or someplace to depend upon for inspiration, assistance, and/or support. There are organizations that encourage parents, teachers, merchants and tradespeople, groups for young and elderly people, etc. Pastoral musicians also have an organizational network that supports and encourages them in their work. It is called the National Association of Pastoral Musicians (NPM).

What is NPM? The National Association of Pastoral Musicians exists to assist every parish in the United States to improve liturgical music on the parish level. The association was founded in 1976 because of the urgent needs in church music.

An outgrowth of the association is a support group of musicians from 12 to 20 parishes. Currently, the Rochester diocese has no active chapter, but work is under way to remedy this situation.

The reasons for having chapters include: 1. to deepen the spiritual life and social interaction among

pastoral musicians; 2. to provide an educational tool for all on current issues affecting musical practice in the parish; 3. to provide a planning tool for activities; and 4. to improve the musical skill of pastoral musicians.

Each chapter meeting includes four sections: a musical showcase for enjoyment, sharing ideas and critique; 2. an exchange for learning — comparing ideas from different parishes; 3. a business section for routine business matters, planning future programs and recruiting new members; and 4. Koinonia (fellowship) — special prayer services for musicians and/or an informal social, including food, drink and relaxation. Each meeting involves at least two parishes taking a leadership role. The formation of NPM chapters in the Rochester diocese would help all of us who serve as pastoral musicians to get together and be supportive of each other, while sharing ideas.

Chapter meetings also call for two meetings a year for clergy and musicians. The support and education of the clergy is a vital factor to our success, just as our support for each other is all important. NPM chapters are primarily educational, and therefore vitally interested in every parish musician and clergy, including both the least adequate musician and the most professional. Chapters are interested in mutual self-help for the musicians.

If you are currently serving a parish as a pastoral musician and have not heard of the association, please take the time to find out about it. Is your parish a member of this organization? Membership includes two copies of the excellent bi-monthly magazine, "Pastoral Music," one for the pastor and one for the parish music director. ### Irene Dengler Schoen

### Donald E. Garland

Weston, Mass. — Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated at St. Julia's Church here for Donald E. Garland July 12, who died unexpectedly July 8, 1982. Mr. Weston had been a physical education director of St. Monica's School in Rochester, a member of the Rush-Henrietta School System, and was principal of Webster High School.

He accepted the position of principal of Weston High School in 1969.

He is survived by his wife, Gertrude; his father, Roy R. Garland of Weston; a brother, Richard R. Garland of Penfield; two aunts, an uncle, and several nieces and nephews.

A memorial has been established as the Donald E. Garland Scholarship Fund. Superintendent's Office, Weston Schools, Weston, Mass.

# Charismatics to Meet At Niagara Weekend

Persons in the charismatic renewal will gather Aug. 6-8 at Niagara University for an Upstate New York General Charismatic Conference. Its organizers hope the meeting will be the first in an annual series.

He is a part of the Scripture Leaders Formation Workshop, and three years ago was elected to head the Steering Committee of the Diocesan Liaisons Committee for the Charismatic Renewal in the United States.
