Washington (NC) — Father Robert N. Sherry of the Diocese of Rockford, Ill., has been named executive director of the secretariats for priestly formation and vocations of the National Conference of Catholic Bishops.

Father Sherry is director of vocations in his own diocese

and was vice president from 1979 to 1981 of the National Conference of Diocesan Vocations Directors.

Ordained in 1966, the priest is also the author of "A Way of the Cross for Vocations," and is co-author of "Healing the Community," a filmstrip and recording.

Deaths Brother Francis, SVD

Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated at the Divine Word Seminary July 12 for Brother Francis (Nicholas C. Gaenger), a brother in the Society of the Divine Word who died at 95 July 7, 1982.

He had been a member of his congregation for 70 years. A native of Hungary, Brother Francis emigrated at the age of 17. He served in his congregation's foundations in Techny, Ill., Miramar, Mass., and in China.

He was assigned to the Conesus foundation in the late 1930s and worked in the winery until the early 1960s. Following his retirement from winery work, he took on duties in the seminary office until his 93rd year. He was described by a society spokesman as "always the devoted, meticulous and conscientious worker."

Among those attending his funeral rites were 50 Sisters of Mercy, at the Conesus facility for a retreat.

Brother Francis is survived by relatives in Europe, California and Michigan, and by many friends.

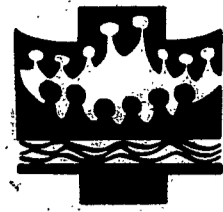
Rosary on The Air

Insights In Liturgy

Let's Look At Baptism

For the next five weeks, Insights in Liturgy will focus on the liturgical celebration of baptism for children. We'd like to look at this sacrament from the points of view of the parents, the sponsors, the assembly, and the minister — people all intricately involved in the initiation celebration of new members.

Baptism is the rite of passage of an individual into the Church family. It is the rite by which the Church communicates in gesture, sound, touch, water, oil, garments and light. God, Creator, recreates; the One who loves calls the beloved; a community celebrates its own existence; and a child celebrates freedom and new life. Understood in such idyllic terms, baptism cannot be an isolated event. It is, rather, a celebration of life. The community enjoys their life together. Parents rejoice in the new life of their child. Combined, the Church, parents, sponsors, minister, and assembly celebrate the "new life" of faith.

Baptism for a child is a significant step because it presents the child with a community in which he/she will grow and come to experience more fully each stage of human life. It is not a community chosen by the child — anymore than children can choose their own parents. The Church, the Family of God called together (chosen) by God,

has summoned her sons and daughters and they transmit this call to their sons and daughters.

Our diocesan guidelines state: "The faith of parents is a crucial pastoral concern since they are accepting the responsibility of forming their children in the practice of the faith." Time should be spent with parents that they rediscover their faith experience, because they are the primary examples of faith to their children.

Sponsors, too, have an important role of witnessing faith in God. "The sponsors/godparents should be fully initiated, practicing Catholics... A practicing Christian of another communion may also be chosen to witness the

Baptism with a Catholic godparent." (Sacramental Guidelines I, c) The honor and responsibility of this role is such that the women and men chosen should see themselves as representatives of the whole of the People of God and serve as model witnesses in the life journey of the child.

The assembly and the minister play an important role in the celebration of Baptism. They represent the presence of the Lord... arms extended to welcome a new child, the warmth of a family to convey the message that one is wanted, the challenge to honesty that the commitment made will be the commitment honored.

Baptism becomes an event. It is not only washing, anointing, clothing and officiating; it is also the celebration of our one foundation of faith: eternal life in Jesus Christ. Our child is called, named, freed from sin, welcomed into a community-family, and all rejoice!
