# New Staffers Fill Diocesan Positions

Five diocesan education posts were filled during the summer. Patrick Fox was hired as director of Youth Ministry, a new office. Sister Virginia Steinwachs, SSJ, was named assistant superintendent for program development and public relations. Sister Anne Guerin, SSJ, was named assistant superintendent for development planning for elementary schools and consultant for secondary schools. Mrs. Maribeth Mancini was named consultant for adult religious education, and Robert Gefell was named assistant superintendent for personnel.

Fox holds a BS in Theology from Iona College. He taught science and theology at Bishop Kearney High School, was director of religious education at Christ the King, and served eight years as director of religious education and youth ministry at St.

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Louis in Pittsford. In addition, he is a teacher in the diocesan CERT program, and an instructor in Nazareth College's continuing education program.

Sister Virginia did undergraduate work at Nazareth College, and graduate work at Geneseo State College and Syracuse University. She has just finished a sabbatical year of theology and scripture studies at Regis Jesuit College in Toronto. She has been a teacher in diocesan schools for several years, the last dozen of which she served as principal, first at Holy Rosary and then at Mother of Sorrows.

Sister Anne holds a masters degree from the University of Notre Dame and has recently attended workshops on planning and development. She has served as secondary school and college teacher for 13 years, as a curriculum resource coordinator for three years, and as principal of a high school for seven years.

Mrs. Mancini holds an MA in Theology from St. Bernard's Insititute and a BA in English from Nazareth College. Widely known for her volunteer activities, Mrs. Mancini has also served as catechist at St. Ambrose Parish, as student manager of St. Bernard's Seminary bookstore, and as student liaison for St. Bernard's Institute.
