



Catholic U. Plans Galileo Lectures

Washington — Twelve lectures on the status of Galilean scholarship will be sponsored this Fall by the Catholic University's School of Philosophy.

The series, "Reinterpreting Galileo: His Significance for the History and Philosophy of Science," will begin with three lectures in September and will bring to the university the world's leading Galilean scholars.

The academic year 1982-83 marks the 350th anniversary of the publication of the "Dialogues" and of Galileo's subsequent condemnation. Recent developments in the history and philosophy of science have generated a new interest in Galileo, who was previously thought to stand at the watershed of two worlds — the classic Aristotelian world view one the one side and modern interpretation on the other.


Recent discoveries of William Wallace, OP, a professor of philosophy and history at Catholic U., have exploded the watershed thesis by showing the indebtedness of Galileo to his predecessors; others have shown the problematic character of Galileo's claims given his evidence.
