"Made in God's image" will be the topic of Auxiliary Bishop Dennis W. Hickey when he delivers the homily at the 37th annual Red Mass at 12:15 p.m., Friday, Sept. 10, at Old St. Mary's Church in downtown Rochester.

Bishop Matthew H. Clark will be celebrant of the Mass which is sponsored by the St. Thomas More Lawyers Guild.

Attending will be lawyers, judges, and law enforcement and fire officials.

Bishop Hickey was born in Dansville where he attended schools. Upon graduation from St. Bernard's Seminary in 1941, he was ordained at Sacred Heart Cathedral.

He has served the diocese in many key positions and was

Free Milk Program Announced

A free special milk policy for Catholic elementary school children unable to pay the full price has been announced by the Office of General Education.

Eligibility will be determined by family size and income. The following schools are participating in the Free Milk Program:

Sacred Heart, Rochester; Corning Catholic Schools; Corpus Christi, Rochester; Good Shepherd, Henrietta; Guardian Angels, Rochester; Holy Cross, Rochester; Holy Trinity, Webster; Most Precious Blood, Rochester; Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Brockport; Our Lady of Lourdes/Our Lady Queen of Peace, Brighton; St. Anne, Rochester;

St. Ann, Hornell; St. Cecilia, Rochester; St. Francis de Sales/St. Stephen, Geneva; St. John the Evangelist, Greece; St. John the Evangelist, Spencerport; St. John of Rochester, Fairport; St. Mary, Auburn; St. Mary, Bath; St. Mary, Canandaigua;

St. Mary, Elmira; St. Michael, Newark; St. Joseph, Wayland; St. James, Waverly; St. Louis, Pittsford; St. Patrick, Owego; St. Patrick, Seneca Falls; St. Salome, Rochester; St. Thomas the Apostle, Rochester.

The policy is sponsored by the Bureau of School Food Management under the U.S. Department of Agriculture, Food and Nutritional Services. School officials will use an income scale and any uncontrollable financial hardship which may affect a family's ability to pay for special milk. Provision is also made for foster children.

Families falling within the income scale are urged to apply by completing application forms sent home in a letter to parents. Individual applications may be submitted any time during the school year.

Each school will designate an official to review applications and determine eligibility. Any dissatisfaction with a ruling by an official may be appealed through a hearing.


