**Evangelization Through Cassettes**

My special apostolate is evangelization, especially through print and cassettes. The following snatches from letters are samples of the method.

To Phil Donahue of the Donahue Show:

"On Sept. 2 I saw the last 10 minutes of your show, which was a panel of three Born Again Christians. As I watched you in action, with your usual posturing and interruptings and general rambunctiousness, I thought: That flannel-mouthed Irishman deliberately distorts the messages of his guests. I noted that these Born Again Christians belonged to no denomination, and surely did not represent the charismatic movement within the Catholic Church. So I'm writing you again requesting that you invite Ralph Martin - Servants Publications, 840 Airport Road, Ann Arbor, Mich. 48107 - to be a guest on your show, representing charismatics generally, but Catholic charismatics in particular. His recent book, *The Crisis of Truth*, is getting fine circulation. Martin is an alumnus of Notre Dame, a disciple of Cardinal Suenens and a friend of Pope John Paul II. While I suppose oddities like Sisters Trexler and Ware from the Coalition of Religious Women, which is more feminist than religious, and the three homosexuals you had on some time ago, and sundry other off-beat folk make stimulating material for your act, why not get Ralph Martin as an exciting change?"

The bishop was at Sacred Heart, Auburn, for the missions, and so impressed one parishioner that he has pledged to give the money to support a seminarian through his whole seminary course. This will amount to around \$7,000. In making a will it would be good for some to designate a bequest to the Propagation of the Faith "for the education of native priests and Sisters." What a privilege to give a priest or Sister to the Church!

years, particularly on the intermediate level. She taught 14 years at St. John the Evangelist, Rochester, and nine years at St. Cecilia's, Rochester. A six-year term at St. James, Rochester, was her last teaching assignment. She also taught at Holy Cross, St. Andrew's, Our Lady of Mercy, Annunciation and St. Helen's in Rochester; St. Rita's, West Webster; and St. Patrick's, Owego.

Sister Mary Alphonsus Kruckow, a former executive councilor of the congregation, has been director of purchasing at St. James Mercy Hospital in Hornell since 1969. She taught mathematics, science and religion at Our Lady of Mercy High School for 19 years. For nine years she was assistant director of Mercy novices, and for 15, was executive house manager at the motherhouse. She joined the St. James Mercy Hospital staff in 1967.

Sister Mary Alberta Kuhn, former high school administrator and English teacher, is now beginning a ministry to the elderly at St. Ann's Parish, Hornell. She was born in Olean, and in her 43-year teaching ministry in diocesan high schools; was at Notre Dame High School in Elmira, where she served as teacher, then vice principal and

finally principal. She taught 15 years at Aquinas Institute, 15 years at Cardinal Mooney High School and four years at Our Lady of Mercy High School. In addition she served a term as assistant to the superior general of her congregation.

Sister Mary Eugene Pearson has been a teacher for 49 years, with more than 37 years spent at the junior high level teaching religion and English for the most part. She served at St. Salome's, Rochester, for 11 years, at St. John the Evangelist, Rochester, for 15 years (with four years as teacher-principal), and at Holy Cross, Rochester, where she has been since 1967. In addition she has taught at St. Charles, St. Andrew's and St. Helen's, all in Rochester.


