Polish Primate To Visit Buffalo

He is coming to celebrate the 600th anniversary of the arrival in Czestochowa, Poland, of the famous icon of Our Lady of Czestochowa.

patroness of Poland, and to thank Americans for assistance given the people of Poland.

On Oct. 26 here, Archbishop Glemp is to preside at a. special meeting of Polish priests and nuns and to bless a. new chapel in honor of Blessed Maximilian Kolbe, a. Polish Franciscan priest killed during World War II, who is to be canonized on Oct. 10.

Father Gowin said the visit will be the first to the United States by a Polish primate. Archbishop Glemp, 53, was named archbishop of Warsaw and Gniezno in July 1981, succeeding the late Cardinal Stefan Wyszynski. He also will visit Philadelphia, Detroit, Toronto, Cleveland; Springfield, Mass.; Worcester, Mass.; Boston, Chicago, Detroit; Orchard Lake, Mich.; New York City and Newark, NJ.
