Rare More Book Added to Li

Rochester Library announced last Thursday, Sept. 23, the acquisition of its two millionth volume, a rare 1557 largepage format edition of "The Workes of Sir Thomas More."

The mark was attained 16 years after the acquisition of the one millionth volume, and 132 years after the opening of the library itself.

One of the most significant books in the English Renaissance, the More edition was presented as a gift to the university in memory of two University of Rochester alumni — Ruth Gliddon Ostendorf, Class of 1918, and

The University of Otto McKinley Ostendorf, Class of 1919 — by their daughter, Marie Ostendorf Wells, Class of 1950.

> Guest speaker at the announcement was Dr. Louis Martz Sterling Professor of English, and former director of the Beinecke Library at Yale University. Dr. Martz stated that the More volume was and is a milestone in the history of printing, and is comparable to a first folio of Shakespeare.

127 copies of the Workes left, but probably not more than 50 or 60 perfect copies like this one remain," Dr. Martz said.

Dr. Martz said that he had examined more than 20 volumes of the More edition, "but I've only seen three that can equal this."

> The volume contains more than one million words written by the great scholar and saint. The last entry in the 1458-page volume is a letter written to his daughter, Margaret Roper, only days before he was beheaded.

> Asked the value of such a famous book, Dr. Martz shrugged "Certainly in the thousands of dollars," he estimated.
