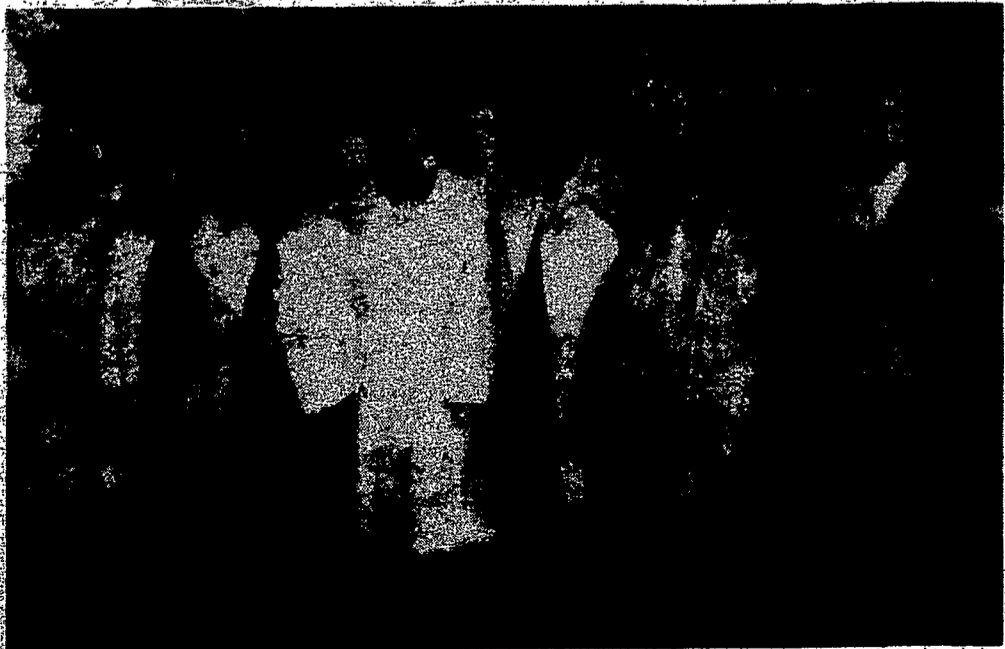
Holy Apostles
