Dan and Margaret Whalen, the diocesan lay missionary team which has developed three missions dedicated to St. Martin de Porres in Mexico, have launched a fund-raising campaign for the poor of their

mission area. Dedicating their efforts this year to the memory of Father Josphé Reinhart, the late director of the Diocesan Missions Office who en-

couraged them in their work, the Whalens are asking for contributions to continue their mission endeavors.

This is the 24th year the Whalens have worked in Mexico; and last year alone

they served more than 8,000 people.

Saints Are Big Topic For St. Andrew's Pupils

Lucien Cayer hit on a great idea last year when he proposed that students at St. Andrew's School be given saturation courses on the

saints. Cayer, religious education coordinator at the parish, has seemingly pulled out all stops to further the children's appreciation of

saints, even to the point of arranging for Humane Society demonstrations to illustrate the care St. Francis of Assisi showed toward animals, as a single example.

Last week, with the blessing of Sister Therese Richardson, school principal, children in the primary grades at St. Andrew's were led through booklets published by the Franciscan Communications on the life of Francis. They saw Cayer dressed up in a Franciscan habit, and they had the opportunity to hear Craig Walker of the Humane Society describe the care of birds.

Later this month the children will be asked to help fashion a plaque with Francis' picture and a motto the children think would best show the lessons one can learn from Francis' life.

The plaques will be installed in Saints' Hall of Fame at the school.

Eventually, Cayer said last week, several saints will be featured. They include Martin De Porres, Elizabeth Seton, the Nagasaki Martyrs, St. Patrick, St. Catherine of Siena, Mary, Vincent De Paul and Louise De Marillac, Augustine, among them. Each of the saints is featured in a Franciscan Communications booklet, and each of the programs is geared to the pupils' grade level.

The idea is that the children are being presented with positive role models. Cayer said that children constantly are being presented with negative role models by society, but that "Catholics have all sorts of positive models in the saints. The program encourages the kids to recognize these positive models."
