☐ EXPERIENCE IN GOVERNMENT

As Secretary of State, Mario Cuomo consolidated agencies and reduced costs, and he began the nursing home investigation. As Lt. Governor, he set budgets, planned programs and set priorities. He sat on the Yonkers Financial Control Board, developed Buffalo's Economic Development Task Force for jobs, and managed the state-wide Ombudsman's Program to give people access to government. *Lew Lehrman has no government experience.*

☐ EXPERIENCE IN THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE SYSTEM

The PBA, the New York Police Conference, the ABSCAM and WATERGATE prosecutors, the state's toughest district attorneys, the former chief judge of the state's highest court, the court officers, the prison guards and the probation officers have all endorsed Mario Cuomo for Governor because he has twenty-five years experience in the criminal justice system and knows how to make it work.
