Also being planned is a table for the needy. Donations asked include staples, canned and pre-packaged food items. Further information is available by calling Jean Corey, 464-0758.

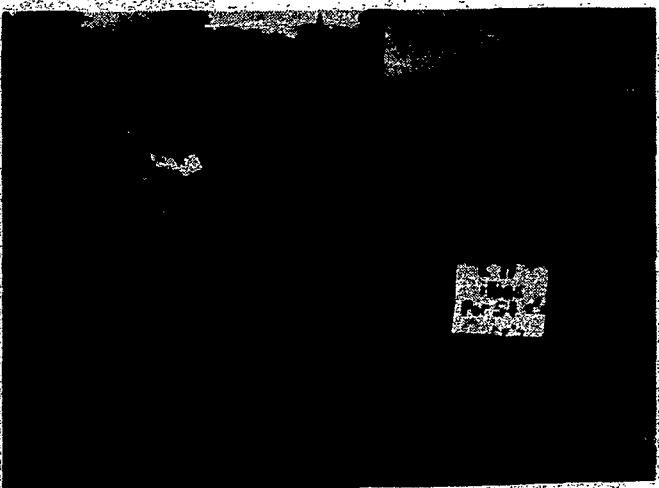
## St. Andrew


