Jesuit Volunteer Corps Given Assignments Here

Institutions in the diocese are for the first time employing the abilities of members of the Jesuit Volunteer Corps this year.

Members of the corps, four single young adults, are working in a variety of posts here, each earning about \$85 a month for their labors.

The four are Mary Barringer, who is acting as assistant to the director of the Campaign for Human Development; Gregg Bonfiglio, parish worker for St.

Monica and St. Augustine parishes; Bernie McDonough, teacher at St. Andrew's School under the direction of the episcopal director of Urban Ministry; and Michael Rae, assistant to the coordinator of the diocesan International Justice and the Peace Commission, and to the coordinator of the Human Life Commission.

The Jesuit Volunteer Corps has about 80 members serving in the eastern U.S., and about 350 nationwide, Bonfiglio said recently.

The program has a spiritual dimension, a testing of traditional material values, and a base in the counsels of poverty and simplicity.

What corps members are not, however, is "cheap labor," they all agree. The corps administration is very selective of the posts to which volunteers are assigned, they said.

The four will work here for the next year, and will focus principally on questions of justice and peace.

Sister Leona LeFrois, SSJ

A native of Webster, Sister

Leona entered the Sisters of St. Joseph in 1922 after she graduated from St. Mary's Hospital School of Nursing.

She earned her bachelor's degree in nursing education from Marquette University, Milwaukee, in 1926, and her master's degree in nursing administration from Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C., in 1936.

A dedicated nurse, Sister Leona's years of service were spent in various nursing capacities. She served at St. Joseph's Hospital in Elmira for 34 years in such varied capacities as instructor in

nursing, director of nurses, supervisor of nursing students and health coordinator.

She also worked for seven years as dean of residents at Nazareth College, served for a short period at St. Ann's Home, and, in 1971, took up nursing the Sisters at the motherhouse infirmary, where she also served as local superior.

She retired in 1976 because of failing health.

She is survived by two brothers, George of Rochester and Arthur of Webster, and several nieces, nephews and cousins.
